CHESTER, N.S. (CP) — Mrs. Mary Lefebvre of Cleveland Sunday unveiled a plaque here in memory of her mother Mrs. Margaret House Eaton, first wife of industrialist Cyrus Eaton. It was unveiled at the Baptist church in connection with the dedication of an organ, a gift of the Eaton family. Mrs. Eaton's younger son, MacPherson Eaton, delivered the sermon. Cyrus Eaton is the Cleveland industrialist who was born at Pugwash, N.S., site of his famous home for thinkers.

**18 New Cases Go To Hospital**

MONTREAL (CP) — Eighteen new cases of polio were admitted to Montreal hospitals during the weekend, bringing the total number of polio cases so far this year to 354.

One new death was reported, raising the polio death toll to 30. City health director Dr. Adela Groulx said the weekend polio figures show that the city's current polio epidemic continues to improve.

He said there were 233 victims from Montreal itself, 109 from suburban Montreal areas and 212 from areas outside of Montreal. Eight persons from the city have died, nine from the metropolitan area and 13 from outside the city.
