NEW IDEAS FOR CUPBOARDS

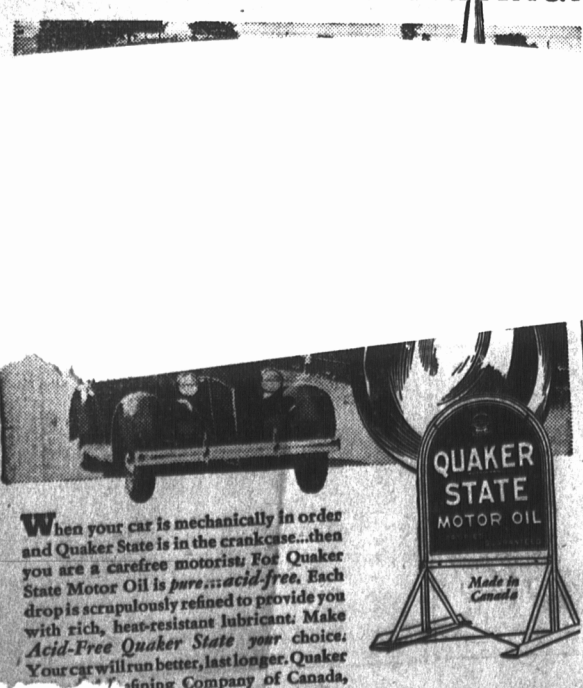
For anybody who has inherited a real linen pride there are some revolutionary ideas for linen cupboards that will make it all such more worth being proud of. Most of the usual old linen cup-

In some cases, as far back as 1928, there was at least one official City receipt issued for taxes, and no record made in the City accounts. This receipt would appear to have come from a concealed receipt book with the same numbering as the receipt book that was actually being regularly used in the City Office at that time.

From the above, it can readily be seen that, in the case of taxes, our report must be tentative only. Until the tax bills go out and we have a chance to find out from the citizens whether or not any further items have been paid but not recorded in the City Cash, it is not possible for us to state that, in our opinion, the arrears of taxes as set out in the Balance Sheet are correct. We can only state that they are in agreement with the City records.

The tremendous amount of detail work entailed in establishing from the City records the amount of arrears of taxes actually owing has been necessitated by the complete lack of a proper system of accounting in your City office, coupled with the apparent disregard by your City Clerk of the extent of his powers in connection with taxes.

Recommendations

It is our opinion that the tax records of the City should start with an Assessment Book, made up each year in duplicate by the City Assessor, sufficiently early for citizens to be notified of their assessment and given time to appeal before the Council strike the tax rate. This permits of the Assessment Book, once it is completed, being adjusted only by the findings of the Appeal Court, and, when so adjusted, remaining in the City Clerk's office as a permanent and unaltered record of the final assessment for the year, from which the Council can strike a proper tax rate. The next step should be the making up of the Rate Book and the sending out of tax bills from which there could be no appeal. This book should then remain, like the Assessment Book, an unchangeable record of the exact taxes levied. Before the succeeding year's taxes become due, all unpaid balances remaining in the old Rate Book should be transferred to an Arrears Ledger. We have opened such a ledger for all unpaid taxes as at January 15, 1939, and recommend that the remaining steps in connection with handling taxes in the manner set out above be taken in order that the 1940 Assessment may be properly handled.

In view of the great extent of the changes which are necessary, it might be advisable at this time to go even further, and have a general survey made of your whole system of Assessment from the viewpoint of principles being followed. This work is entirely outside our scope, but we feel that, if it is to be done, any
