INFORMATION CORNER

 Lying at the very crux of this subject of Amagamation is the subject of Water and Sewerage, and in this connection you will hear mention of the Crandall Report. Just who then is this "Crandall" and what is this "Crandall Report" all about? Well, Crandall is William P. Crandall, professional engineer at Montreal, N. B., who at the request of the Metropolitan Committee was engaged last year by the City of Charlotte-Town to carry out a topographic water and sewerage survey of the City of Charlotte-Town and its suburban areas including the Villages of Parkdale and Spring Park and to prepare a written report including comparison estimates of costs of both separate and integrated water and sewerage systems, such report to assist the citizens of Charlotte-Town and the residents of such suburban areas to arrive at the most practical and feasible solution, as per the Minutes of City Council Meeting of September 10th, 1956.

His report in this regard was subsequently submitted to the City Council, together with the Commissioners of Parkdale and Spring Park at a Special Joint Meeting held on March 16th, 1957, at which an expenditure of \$10,000 for this Crandall Survey and Report was picked up and paid by the City of Charlotte-Town as one of its contributions to this whole study of the Facts concerning Amagamation.

RECOMMENDATIONS
 And what has this Crandall Report in say with regard to this question of water and sewerage for Parkdale and Spring Park?
 Well for one thing it tells us that "from an engineering and financial standpoint the servicing of the Metropolitan Area of Charlotte-Town leaves no alternative but a determined effort by all responsible parties to overcome any differences which would prevent a common installation" and then goes on to illustrate this point by estimating the costs involved in putting in an integrated system for Parkdale and Spring Park at \$1,616,000, and for Spring Park at \$270,000, against costs of \$261,465.00, if installed separately and alone by Parkdale at \$428,800.00, and by Spring Park separately and alone at \$147,700.00.

Thus the having to the residents of Parkdale and Spring Park through Amagamation in this one field of water and sewerage capital costs alone, is estimated by Mr. Crandall to amount to a total of \$261,465.00. That's a lot of money to be wasted by Parkdale and Spring Park with populations of only 1370 and 1346 persons respectively.

WELL QUALIFIED
 Incidentally this same W.H. Crandall, professional engineer of Montreal, N. B. is the same engineer who has been engaged on other occasions before and since by both Parkdale and Spring Park to carry out individual Village projects of their own for these Villages, so it can be assumed that the Commissioners of Parkdale and Spring Park, as with the City Council of Charlotte-Town, have complete faith in his abilities, his surveys, and his estimates of costs involved. Thus the \$64 Question of Amagamation might well be this one: Can and should the residents of Parkdale and Spring Park take on an expenditure of \$965,580, to provide separate water and sewerage systems of their own, or would it be more feasible and more sensible to Amagamate, thus first taking advantage of Crandall's estimated savings of the \$261,466, above mentioned, and then going on to

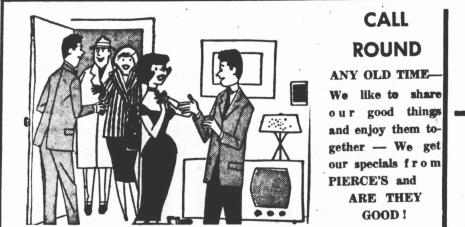
