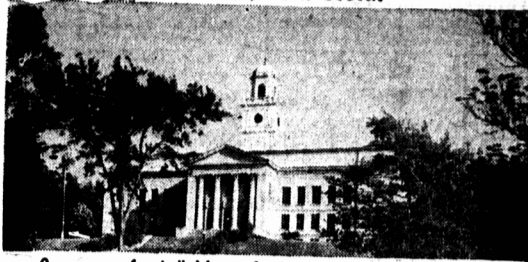
SERIOUSLY ILL

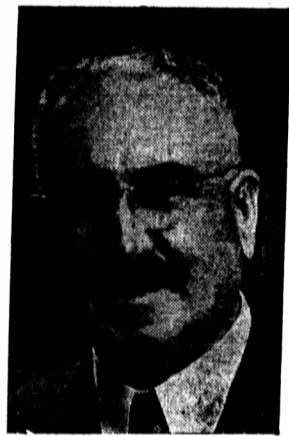
