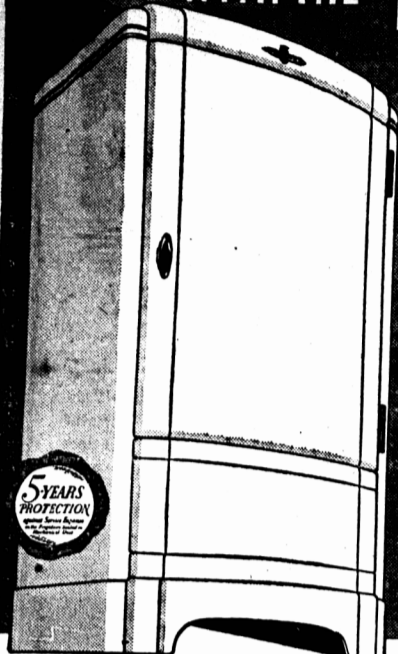

FISHERMEN HONORED FOR HEROIC RESCUE

HALIFAX, May 4.—(CP)—Ten Portuguese Cove fishermen who played heroic roles in the rescue of 28 members of the crew of the British freighter Kenkerry when she ran aground on Black Rock on Jan. 17, 1935, have received rewards—\$15 each—from the British Board of Trade.

While the 3,930-ton vessel was being pounded to pieces by a raging storm, a breeches buoy was rigged by the fishermen and the crew hauled over the tossing seas to safety. Captain Duncan Milne, who stayed aboard his ship until the last moment, was drowned when he missed his footing as he stepped into the buoy and plunged into the waves.

Those receiving the rewards were Christopher Purcell, Roy Purcell, Bresnan Purcell, Ernest Purcell, Everett Purcell, Bertram Purcell, Clyde Purcell, Rose Purcell, George Sandler and Edward Burke.

Presentation was made by Hon. J. L. Ilsley, K. C., Minister of National Revenue, on behalf of Hon. C. D. Howe, Minister of Marine, who was unable to be in Halifax for the occasion.

HIGH EXPRESS RATES ON FISH

Mr. MacLean, M. P., Urges Action By Departmental Officials.

Speaking in the House of Commons on April 29 on the vote of \$200,000 paid in expanding the sale of products of Canadian fishermen in foreign and domestic markets, Mr. A. E. MacLean, Prince, said: "I think the minister is to be congratulated upon the vote which he has placed in the estimates. I believe the idea of trying to help our fishermen by providing markets is one which will commend itself and bring better results than anything else. We have various kinds of the finest fresh fish in the Maritimes but our difficulty is in finding a market. While my hon. friend (Mr. Neill) was speaking he referred to the cost of getting our fish onto the markets of the world. I have on my desk a bill sent me a few days ago by one of our fishermen in the Maritimes. He sent 125 pounds of fresh smelts to the New York market. They sold at eighteen cents a pound, or a total of \$22.50, but the charges amounted to \$13.39 or over forty-three per cent of the total value of the fish."

Mr. Bennett: "He shipped them by express."

Mr. MacLean: "Yes, there were shipped by express. There is the difficulty. For a long time we have been endeavouring to get lower express rates, and possibly this line could be taken into consideration, under this vote, by the minister. It is true that shipping to the United States is subject to international express rates, and that we have no control over United States rates. But I believe that if the departmental officials would take this matter up officially with the Canadian express companies and also try to get some cooperation from the United States companies, a great saving could be made to the benefit of our shippers in the east. When forty-three per cent of the value of a small shipment of fish goes in commissions and express rates, it is pretty discouraging to the man who is endeavouring to catch fish and carry on. I feel, however, that in respect of this item the minister is moving in the right direction. We need to expand our markets, and I believe there is a greater field in respect to fisheries than in anything else. Not only have we to find markets but we must also instruct our fishermen in putting up fish in such a way that it will reach the markets of the world in the best possible condition. I wish the minister the best of success. I bring these points to his attention to indicate a line of activity which I think could usefully be pursued."

PHOENIX RANKS SHOW FEW LOSSES

REGINA, May 3.—(C.P.)—The pheasant population of Saskatchewan came through the recent severe winter without heavy casualties, game department officials say.

While a number of deaths were caused by bitter weather and lack of feed, farmers and observers place the figure at considerably below earlier estimates.

The pheasants were brought to the province from North Dakota in exchange for Hungarian partridges. Under the arrangement Saskatchewan has shipped 300 partridges to North Dakota to complete the exchange.
