ASSIGNMENT OF STUDY CARRELS IN THE ROBERTSON LIBRARY

Study carrels in the Robertson Library for the 1986 Fall Semester will not be given out on Registration Day. The Senate Library Committee decided at a recent meeting that study carrels will be assigned in the lobby of the Robertson Library on Monday, September 8, 1986, at 8 a.m. as follows:

Freshmen	20%	= 36 Carrels
Sophomores	20%	= 36 Carrels
Juniors	30%	= 54 Carrels
Seniors	30%	= 54 Carrels

There will be four lines, one for each category. Carrels will be assigned on a 'come first, serve first' basis by picking a number from a box. Carrel assignments may not be traded. This arrangement has been worked out to achieve a quiet atmosphere necessary for study.

FORMER SMOKING STUDY AREA REASSIGNED AS A 'SUPER QUIET AREA'

Following the successful example of other university libraries, the Robertson Library has designated a "super quiet area" which will be located in the former smoking study hall to the right of the main study hall above the Circulation Desk.
