Guy Burgess Is Permitted Private Income Transfer

LONDON (Reuters) — The government has confirmed that Guy Burgess, British diplomat who defected to Russia in 1951, was allowed to transfer his private income from London to Moscow.

The confirmation was given in the House of Lords by Lord Mills, minister without portfolio. After the matter was raised by Conservative peer Viscount Massereene, Burgess said a published report that the British treasury has allowed the transfer by classifying Burgess as an emigrant is correct.

"I understand that Burgess is treated for exchange control purposes as permanently resident abroad," Mills said, adding that payments made from Britain to such a non-resident follow the transfer of his current income.

Lord Massereene said it was an extraordinary state of affairs if the government classed suspected traitors as emigrants. Mills replied that although references to Burgess might

Canadian Art Show To Open In Bordeaux

BORDEAUX, France (CP) — A big exhibition of Canadian art has opened in this city of southwestern France.

The exhibition, part of the annual festival of Bordeaux, involves more than 200 works from the National Gallery of Canada, the National Museum of Canada, the Royal Ontario Museum and the art galleries of Toronto, Montreal, Quebec, Vancouver, Halifax and Hamilton plus several private and public collections.

Of the total, about 55 are Canadian paintings, 20 are Canadian paintings, 20 are Indian masks, Indian sculptures and samples of old Canadian furniture will also be on display.

Some 100,000 visitors are expected to see the exhibition, which runs to the end of July. Those attending opening ceremonies will include Georges Lapalme, minister of Quebec cultural affairs; Canadian Ambassador Pierre Dupuy; Rene Garneau, minister of external affairs; Charles Lussier, Quebec delegate-general in Paris; and Robert Kite, his assistant.

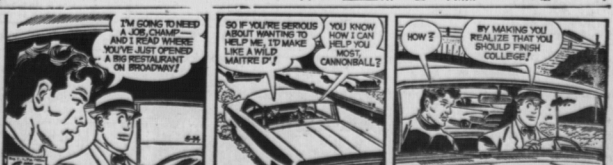
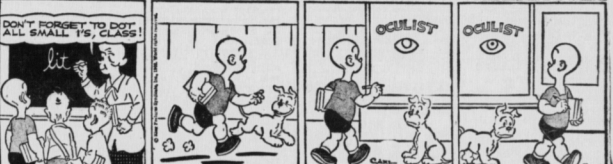
