Inquest At Summerside Is Adjourned

An inquest into the deaths of three persons as a result of a train-motor truck collision at Travellers Rest crossing on Dec. 12 was adjourned at Summerside last night after one witness had given evidence. It will resume on Jan 4 at 6 p. m., at which time it is expected that Urbain Doiron, the driver of the vehicle will be sufficiently recovered to give evidence.

The witness heard last night was Dr. Gilbert Gallant of Summerside, who described the injuries suffered by Mrs. Urbain Doiron, the third of the injured to die. He said the cause of her death apparently was a blood clot on a lung, but that she had suffered many injuries, some of them internal.

Other victims of the accident were Mrs. Doiron's four-year-old son, Marcel and her mother-in-law, Mrs. Sarah Doiron, who died shortly after the collision. Mrs. Urbain Doiron lived until Dec. 18.

Mr. Doiron had been released from hospital, but was said not in condition to give evidence. Dr. Austin Delaney is the coroner.

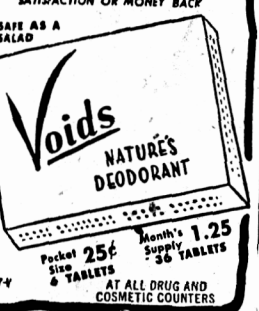
