Legality Is Deliated Of Postal Walkout

OTTAWA (CP) — Depending on who you ask the postal strike is legal, illegal or not a strike at all, just an unofficial work stoppage.
The latter definition comes closest to the facts.
The three national postal associations, like all civil service groups, are not covered by the Canada Labor Relations Act, the federal Industrial Disputes and Investigations Act or provincial variations of the latter under which most industrial strikes are conducted.
Several cabinet ministers have called the walkouts "illegal" but when asked what law is being breached all they could point to was the Civil Service Act — which doesn't mention either strikes or walkouts.
The regulations accompanying the Civil Service Act do say that an employee's position can be

The federal Labor Relations Act deals with industries and corporations under federal jurisdiction, such as the railways, and the Industrial Disputes and Investigations Act specifically excludes federal employees from its provisions.
It's the latter act or its provisions that govern the postal strike.
