MONDAY

Oriental silks and satins, and memories of brief shore leaves and heavy bombardments were brought home over the week-end by Island crew members of H. M. C. S. Nootka which arrived in Halifax recently after nearly year's absence in the Far Eastern area.

There were four Islanders returning on the ship, and they are now enjoying a solid leave period ranging up to 67 days. The boys are P. O. E. E. Platts, 45 Upper Hillsboro Street, P. O. J. Howe formerly of Hope River but now living in Halifax; AB. K. Smith, East Royalty, and LS. H. MacAuland, formerly of Alberton.

The competition for funds and students resulting from the number of universities in the Maritimes leads, in many instances, to "an almost appalling disregard for standards," reports Dr. Frank MacKinnon, Principal of Prince of Wales College, in a survey conducted for the Canadian Social Science Research Council.

"Courses labelled 'honours' and 'graduate' are often provided as attractions with few if any of the facilities necessary to make them of any real value to students," Dr. MacKinnon notes. "Moreover, many 'credits' can be secured by attendance at summer school or by correspondence without any safeguards against the weakness of these forms of instruction. The conception of university education on the part of both teachers and students is materially affected by these conditions."

TUESDAY

An increase of one cent a quart in the price of milk in the Charlottetown and Montague areas is provided for in price changes along with maximum charges for table cream in the Borden area, announced here yesterday by the Prince Edward Island Milk Control Board and effective September 1 next.

On September 1 the price of milk in Charlottetown will be allowed to advance from 16 to 17 cents a quart and from 15 to 16 cents in the Montague area on all retail sales. There are provisions for corresponding increases in both areas for milk sold in smaller containers.

Effective September 10 next, no person will be permitted to cut more than two acres of forest land or more than 20 cords of pulpwood or pit props in any calendar year, without first having obtained a permit from the Minister of Industry and Natural Resources, according to the latest Forestry Act regulations announced yesterday.

Hon. Eugene Cullen, Minister of Industry and Natural Resources, said this does not mean that woodlot owners will be restricted to cutting only two acres of forest land in a year. It means, he said, that those who will cut more than two acres may be asked to comply with certain provisions aimed at preserving and protecting the Province's woodlots.

Once again the anniversary of Sanatorium Wgek was thoughtfully remembered by the members of the Parkdale Women's Institute as they presented handsome bouquets of flowers to all patients at the Sanatorium Sunday. Each of the bouquets was accompanied by a suitable verse. This kind action is one which the Parkdale W. I. has done each year since the inception of Sanatorium Wgek in 1943.

Over 2300 registered at historic Confederation Chamber and Commissioner Robert Craig estimates that only three of every five people who come in to see it ever sign the book. At the Travel Bureau it is the same story with upwards of 3000 having registered.

This year the tourists came from all parts of the world. Every province in Canada is represented as well as 30 of the United States. In addition, people came from such widely scattered places as England and Australia, Norway and the British West Indies, Java and the Isle of Man, Scotland, and the Ural Mountains of Soviet Russia, Holland and Pakistan.

In the Confederation Chamber last year there were 4500 people registered. This year to date they have been 6,750, an increase of 2250 people with four months still to come.

A million dollar reconstruction job is to be done at the Marine Wharf, Summerside for which tenders have just been called. It is expected that the work will commence this Fall and continue into 1952. Mr. J. Watson MacNaught, M.P. who has been actively engaged in promoting this project with the federal officials at Ottawa, yesterday expressed satisfaction that tenders have been called and explained what will be involved in the extensive plans that have been prepared. The work will consist of reconstructing the outer end and both faces of the wharf as well

as the dredging of berths on the west and east sides and erection of a new transit shed. Last summer a new frost-proof storage warehouse was built and now the second shed on the wharf will be torn down and replaced.

A minimum price of 90 cents per bushel on seed potatoes of the Green Mountain and Katahdin varieties, and \$1.10 per bushel for Irish Cobblers, Sebago, Pontiac and other varieties, was announced yesterday by Mr. D. A. MacDonald, chairman and manager of the P. E. I. Potato Marketing Board.

No minimum price was set on tablestock potatoes and that seed varieties is subject to later change if conditions warrant. The New Brunswick Potato Marketing Board is taking similar action, it was said by Mr. MacDonald, who in company with Mr. S. G. Peppin, technical adviser to the local board, met with the members of that board recently.

In order to satisfy the urge of children to learn at a pre-school age, the experimental class, to be known as Junior Grade 1 (Kindergarten), will commence at West Kent School shortly after the regular school opening on Sept. 4th.

The curriculum will consist of approximately forty activities, under the guidance of Mrs. Charles Willett, formerly a member of the staff of Prince Street School, and will include handicrafts, memorizing of rhymes and songs, playing action-games, sand table play, finger painting, free drawing, coloring with paint and crayons. A record player will provide the music for a rhythm band and the musical activities.

Mr. Chester E. Shaw, District Fruit and Vegetable Division Inspector for the Dominion Department of Agriculture, said yesterday his department has issued instructions to refuse to certify potatoes until after they had been held 10 days. If they were examined the day after being dug they would appear perfect but within a very few days blight might begin to show. He strongly favored leaving them in the ground to insure three weeks of fine dry weather. He said that withholding certification had been used as a preventive measure before when serious blight was present or there was a danger of immature potatoes.
