Steady Increase Noted In Sheep Population In N. S.

HALIFAX (CP)—Nova Scotia's sheep population, which reached its low point late in the Second World War, rose to 97,000 this year and may reach 100,000 in 1957.

While shepherds look back wistfully on the 130,000 sheep of 1941 and the 196,000 of 1931, their wool returns 40 cents.

Wave Of Anti-Communism Reported From Bulgaria

BELGRADE (Reuters)—Reports of unrest in Bulgaria are filtering daily into Belgrade from Sofia.

Police, who have been ordered to shoot to kill in case of trouble, are being coldly treated and phrases such as "future victim" are found chalked up on the doors of secret police and Communist party members during the night.

Copies of pictures published in the press showing Communist and secret policemen hanging in Budapest have been cut out and mailed anonymously to leading party officials.
