

Yankees And Braves Hike Leads Up To 5 1/2 Games

Milwaukee's streaking Braves and New York's (ho-hum) Yankees fastened their leads today's games in the major league pennant race Sunday.

The Braves, winding up a three game sweep of second-place St. Louis and stretching their win streak to seven, bounced the Cardinals 5-1 in fashioning the biggest advantage of any National League leader in more than a year.

The Yankees did their part in a 7-2 romp over Baltimore and picked up a half game in the American League on runner-up Chicago, which split a double-header with Detroit, winning 11-2, after dropping an 8-5 opener.

Lankey Gene Conley won his fifth straight and eighth in his last nine decisions with a seven-hitter for Milwaukee. The Braves also showed a game and a half pickup on Boston's reeling champions, beating twice by last place Pittsburgh, 4-3, in 10 innings and 6-2.

The Brooks, 6 1/2, hold a half-game grip on third over Cincinnati, and fifth-place Philadelphia is nine behind in a race

quickly turning from a riddle into a romp.

The Redlegs and Chicago Cubs were rained out of a double-header in Cincinnati while Philadelphia split with New York, winning the nightcap 2-0 for Jack Sanford's 15th after Curt Barclay's second straight shutout and featured the Giants' 5-0 victory in the opener.

In other American League games, Boston swept two of Washington, 8-5 and 4-3 in 11 innings, and Kansas City, winning for new manager Harry Craft, bounced Cleveland down to sixth place with 7-0 and 9-8 victories.

Ed Mathews, hammered his 22nd home run and a single for two runs and Johnny Logan added a two-run double in handing the nose-diving Cardinals their sixth straight loss. Sam Jones was the loser.

Charley (Whammy) Douglas, a one-eyed right-hander just up from the minors, beat Brooklyn in the nightcap.

In the opener, Paul Smith's homer with two out in the ninth off Clem Labine tied the score at 3-3 and Bill Mazeroski's single drove in the winning run in the 10th.

Sanford, tying Milwaukee's Bob Buhl as the NL's top winner, and Barclay, 25-year-old husky, traded three-hit shutouts in the Phils-Giants doubleheader. Willie Mays had two singles and two triples during the double-header, stretching his hit streak through 18 games.

Believers Ike Delock and Mike Kazanski picked up victories in Boston's sweeps of Washington. Ted Williams was twice walked intentionally for a total of 27, breaking the major league season's record of 26 set by Brooklyn's Duke Snider last year.

Williams ended the day hitting .377 for an eight-point lead over New York's Mickey Mantle, who went 1-for-4 against Baltimore and dropped to .379.

NEW YORK (AP)—Veteran lefthander Warren Spahn fired a five-hitter to record the 40th shutout of his major league career as the Braves routed Washington 4-1 despite the fact that Ted Williams went hitless to end a 17-game hitting streak.

Kansas City Athletics scored three unearned runs in the ninth to defeat Cleveland 8-5.

Brooklyn Dodgers also scored a shutout, 3-0 over Pittsburgh Pirates, as Don Drysdale spaced seven hits. Duke Snider hit his 20th home run of the season for Brooklyn.

Cincinnati edged Chicago Cubs 7-2. Frank Robinson and George Crowe hit homers for the Redlegs. Philadelphia at New York was rained out.

New York Yankees whipped Baltimore Orioles 5-1 in the American League while Chicago White Sox bowed to Detroit 6-4. Mickey Mantle was the Yankee star with four hits including a 450 foot home run.

The Tigers came up with four runs off the White Sox ace Billy Pierce in the ninth to pull the game out of the fire. Reno Bertoia hit a two-run homer in the eighth, singled for two runs in the ninth and Ray Boone's sacrifice fly and Bill Tuttle's single wrapped it up.

Stanhope Wins Golf Ch'ship

MONTREAL (CP)—Betty Stanhope, 19-year-old easy-swinging golfer from the Edmonton Highlands club, piled up a commanding lead Saturday over Mary Gay of Calgary to win the Canadian ladies' open amateur championship 8 and 4.

Making her first appearance in the final, the fall young Edmonton girl had settled it in the morning session of the 36-hole final when she went to lunch with a comfortable six-hole lead.

The next expected bulge that amazed the gallery trouping about the Royal Montreal course came on the morning back nine. Miss Stanhope raked up five straight winning holes against her 25-year-old opponent after making the turn all square. Another win at the 18th, seemed almost superfluous.

When the lead increased to eight holes early in the afternoon, Miss Gay's cause was virtually hopeless. The former Kitchener golfer, whose rallies along the stretch in earlier rounds of the tournament had provided the biggest thrills, made a final gallant effort. With a courageous display she knocked off three holes before succumbing.

When it was all over, Betty said "It feels great to be the champion" but insisted she was nervous from start to finish.

"I know what Mary is capable of doing and I was nervous even after going six holes up in the morning. When Mary started cutting my lead on the back nine in the afternoon I knew I couldn't afford to let up one bit."

The end came at the 32nd. Both

were on the green in two after long drives down the middle. Betty's putt stopped less than a foot from the cup. Mary's was 20 inches short. Conceding the putt to the Edmonton girl, Mary walked over and shook her hand.

The new champion succeeds Marlene Stewart Street of Font-Hill, Ont., who had won the title four times in six years and was eliminated by Miss Gay at the 19th hole in this tournament.

Betty has played in the open six times, starting when she was 14 years old. She has never been near the championship before.
