



## S'ide Survey Reveals Job/Value Of Education

**SUMMERSIDE BUREAU OF THE GUARDIAN**  
Of the 1,243 male persons listed as unemployed at the Summerside office of the National Employment Service, which does not include fishermen, only 33 have graduated from High school or have received higher training.

The survey, which was conducted to determine the importance of skilled training when seeking employment, also revealed that of the 376 females listed as of Dec. 31 only 42 have high school graduation or higher training.

Of the more than 1,600 total unemployed, 1,155 have received education of grade eight or less. Males with less than grade six education number 245, females 43.

Only two of the 1,619 total unemployed are university graduates. Commenting on the survey, Summerside N.E.S. manager, Earl Cannon said that similar age-training studies had been carried out in other years with similar results.

"We have known there are more than 1,100 with less than grade nine education unemployed," Mr. Cannon said, "and there are only two of more than 1,600 with university education without work."

"These figures are compiled to show the public that those without adequate education are the majority of the unemployed. We hope students will heed the warning and get all the education possible."

Men in the 20 to 30 age bracket with grade six to eight education number 320. One hundred, thirty-three men of age 45 to 60 are in the grade six to eight education bracket number 88.

Women from 20 to 45 years of age in the grade six to eight education bracket number 88. Sixty-eight females from age 20 to 35 are unemployed with a grade six education number 245, females 43.

The survey was requested of the Summerside Branch by the regional N.E.S. Office, Moncton, and will be included in a national report to be presented later in the year.

She is joined by John S. Wright of Summerside, president of the Atlantic Provinces Economic Council, representing Prince County and Melvin J. McQuaid of Souris, this province's original member on the Atlantic Development Board, representing Kings County.

It will be the responsibility of this independent panel to select the winner of the award sponsored annually since 1959 by The Evening Patriot. The winner will then join what is the province's most exclusive club numbering only four members.

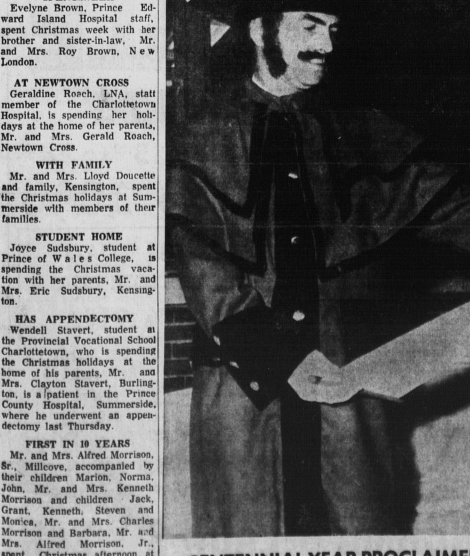
