

First Edition of Home For Thinkers Is Closed Out

PUGWASH, N. S. (CP)—Cleveland industrialist, Cyrus Eaton closed out the first edition of his much-praised "home for thinkers" here Sunday and the world scholars who had been his guests for a week proclaimed the experiment a success.

The Pugwash-born business magnate invited the nine celebrated figures to vacation at his ancestral home on Northumberland street because he "aid, the hurly-burly of modern living permits such men to little time for relaxation and reflection."

A closing banquet was held Saturday in the detached white frame building that houses the dining room of the old homestead with rolling acreage once supported a commercial inn.

Mr. Eaton said he hoped the informal seminar could be broadened from two weeks to occupy the whole of next summer.

He believed "our most objective" for the first meeting had been achieved in that they were able to relax, talk and think together in this beautiful seacoast setting.

"Next year it is my hope that the Pugwash gathering will go on all summer with more world leaders of scholarship and action coming together for a few weeks of the most inspiring comradeship."

He praised Dr. P. C. H. James, McGill University principal and co-guest, for "his collaboration of inestimable value in bringing this first meeting to fruition."

At the dinner, Dr. Walter T. Stace, Princeton University philosopher, presented Mr. Eaton with a scroll which proclaimed that his experiment had opened "ever-increasing possibilities of good."

Dr. Julian Huxley, British biologist and philosopher, said "a gathering of this sort is interesting because it brings together people of different disciplines in an attempt to find out where there is any common ground between them and the philosophers."

Many of the guests brought their wives. Dr. James was accompanied by his attractive wife, Patricia.

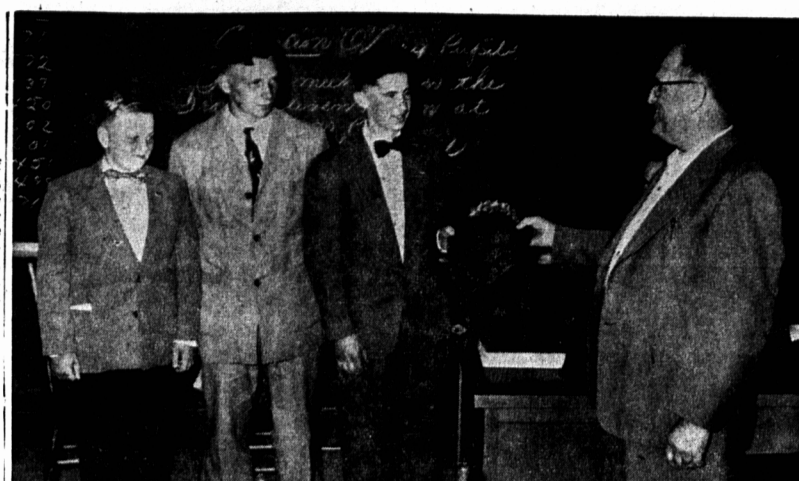
