Jaycees Urge French Section Rejoin National Organization

EDMONTON, CP. Delegates to the annual convention of the Canadian Junior Chamber of Commerce in a spirited speech urged the French Canadian Jaycees to rejoin the national organization.

Major point of the resolution was that English and French speaking groups will have equal representation on a six-member executive. In years when the president speaks French primarily three of the five vice-presidents will be English speaking. In years when the president speaks English as his first language, the extra vice-president will be French-Canadian.

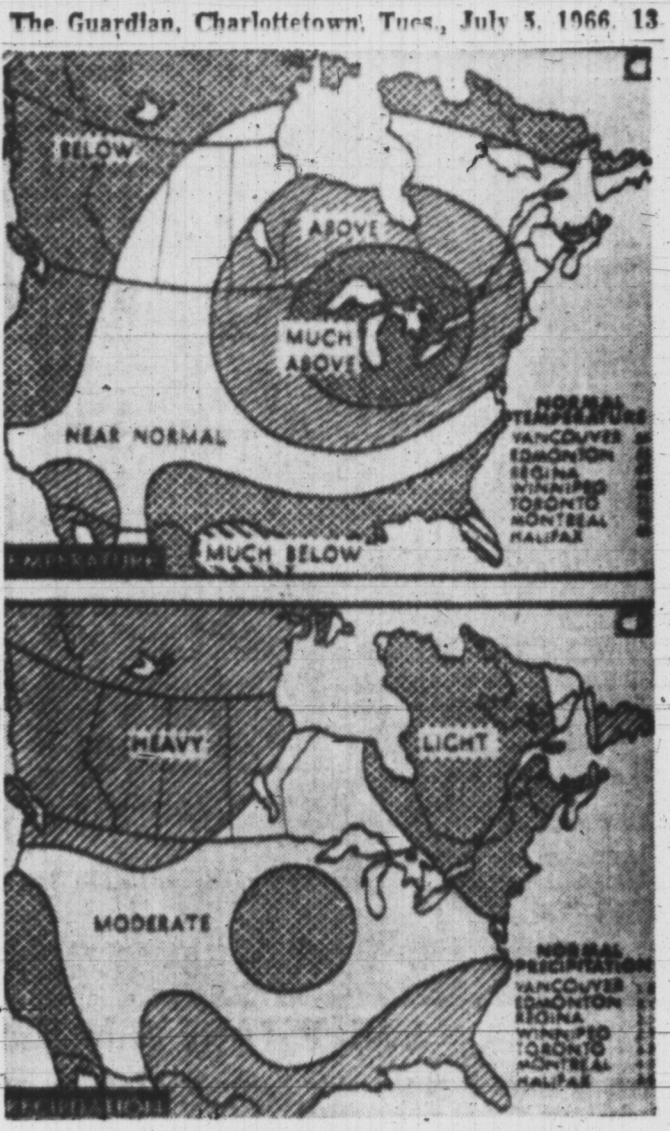
Peter Dorman of St. Bruno, Que., new president of the Jaycees, said in an interview it is possible the federation, with a stated registration of about 9,000, could dominate future conventions, since the Canadian junior chamber counts about 2,000 members.

Mr. Dorman said "Our major objective was to make sure the group does not remain split. A split along these lines could be bad for Canada".

The 244 developed in 1963 when the federation broke from the national organization after applying unsuccessfully for change in the constitution to increase representation on the national executive.

Most of the recommendations concerned internal matters. Mr. Dorman said complete secretarial services of the junior chamber, for the first time, will be printed in English and French if federation officials accept the recommendations.

Mr. Dorman said the resolution possibly is only the first step in a lengthy series of negotiations. No date was set for the beginning of talks.
