PAPER TOWELLING
AID IN KITCHEN

Should Be Taught Children Dorothy Dix

If You Want Your Child to be Prepared for Life Don't Coddle Him — Let Him Learn to Take the Bumps and Come up Fighting and Smiling—It Will Pay You Big Dividends Later

A mother asks: "Can we teach our children a philosophy of life that will be a staff upon which they can lean when the hard sledding comes?"

We cannot protect ourselves against trouble, still less can we save those we love from it. Each of us must live our own lives, and every heart know its own bitterness.

Nevertheless, I do believe that children can be given a philosophy that will be a shield and buckler against which many of the slings and arrows of adverse fortune will glance harmlessly off.

You can so strengthen a child's backbone and put so much grit into its soul while it is still a babe in the cradle that it will grow up into a man or woman who can take the blows that life gives it on the chin and come up smiling.

Children can be taught not to borrow trouble. Most of us spend our lives dreading misfortunes that never happen, and we infect our children with this pessimism instead of inculcating in them with optimism and teaching them the folly of running today by fearing a possible catastrophe tomorrow.

We can teach children to adapt themselves to the people they have to live with and the circumstances in which they are situated. We add a thousandfold to our suffering when we rebel against our fate, but peace and often enjoyment comes with our acceptance of our lots, whatever they are.

We can teach children not to be sorry for themselves. I often think that the worst thing that mothers ever do to their children is to make them feel that they are poor, miserable, unfortunate creatures and that life has given them a dirty deal because they were not born in the millionaire class.

It shatters these children's morale and gives them an inferiority complex because it makes them feel that they are victims of a social order, and it is no use of their struggling against it.

We can teach children that life is a series of compromises; that no one gets all he wants, and that we must learn to take the bitter with the sweet, and like it.

And, if we can teach our children to have the courage to face life with a grin for its struggles and a shrug of the shoulders for its misadventures, they will have a philosophy that will sustain them through many a dark day.

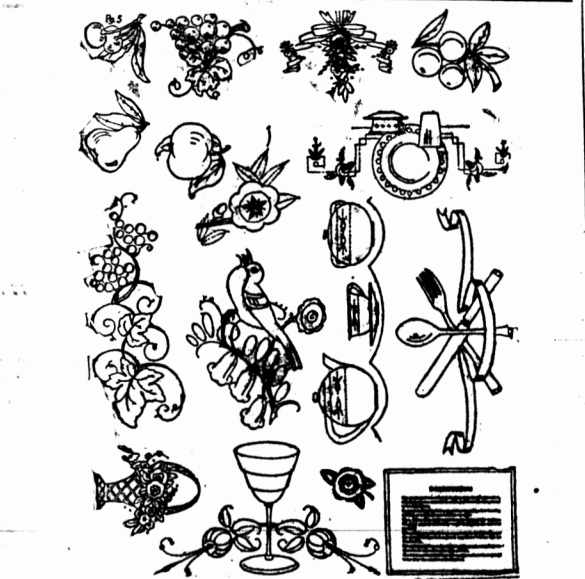

The bread should be stale; the best is two or three days old. Cut off the crusts and break the bread into pieces. Lightly flour a clean cloth, and put the bread into it. Gather the ends together so that it makes a kind of bag, and rub this together so as to crush the bread. Then throw it into a sieve of the coarseness or fineness desired.

A rather rough-and-ready preparation is generally used in our kitchens, beaten egg, or egg-yolk, sometimes even only the white, and bread crumbs, applied anyhow; but if care be taken and a little trouble expended in seeing that the food to be cooked is properly coated there will be a very different and much more successful result.

MARKING LINENS.
Before marking the linens with indelible ink, dip the place to be marked in cold starch, then press with a hot iron. This will give a nice, smooth surface on which to write.

COLORED ICINGS
Cake icings and candy can be nicely colored by using orange juice or egg yolk for yellow, spinach juice for green, black-berry juice for lavender, or red beet juice for pink.

PASTELS FOR EVENING
Some lustrous satin is favored, and many heavy mat sheers in luscious pastels are numbered, namely pale mauvy pink, deeper cyclamen pink, mauve, sky blue, turquoise and citron-yellow.

THE COOK'S CORNER

SALAD DRESSING
1 cup of vinegar, 1/2 cup of granulated sugar, butter the size of a walnut, 2 teaspoons of flour, 1 tablespoon of mustard, 1 egg, a pinch of salt. Mix dry sugar, flour, salt and mustard. Beat the egg and butter and add vinegar. Bring this to a boil.

CAPE OF FUR
Black fullness is a sign by which the new spring fur cape may be recognized. This definite line takes a surprising variety of designs in both flat furs and the long-haired fur capes, sometimes joining with the dipped back hemline to centre attention at the cape back, while in other versions the fullness achieved through gathers or inverted pleats is neatly confined to either side.

A TIGHT SHOE

BEAN SALAD DRESSING
1 cup brown sugar, 1 egg, 1 teaspoon mustard, 1 teaspoon salt, 1 cup vinegar.

BOILED DRESSING
1 small cup sugar, 1-3 cup milk, 1 egg, 1 teaspoon mustard, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1 tablespoon cornstarch. Boil a few minutes in double boiler. Then add 1 cup vinegar. Boil until creamy.

BEAN SALAD DRESSING
1 cup brown sugar, 1 egg, 1 teaspoon mustard, 1 teaspoon salt, 1 cup vinegar. Cook all together until thick, then stir in a couple of tablespoons of cream or milk. Have your beans cooked but not juicy or too soft. Mix the dressing with beans.

FERTILIZER AIDS COCOA INDUSTRY
PORT OF SPAIN, Trinidad, April 7.—(C.P.)—Greatest benefits will be derived by the cocoa industry from fertilization, Dr. F. Pound, the Cocoa Agronomist, forecast after preliminary experiments had been carried out by the Department of Agriculture and the Imperial College of Tropical Agriculture.
