### CURIOUS COINCIDENCE.

Fate of China and Cuba in the Balance.

Great Britain will have its Share of China.

PRESIDENT MCKINLEY WILL COMMIT SPAIN TO THE TENDER MERCIES OF CONGRESS.

Chinese Ministry Charged With Being Bribed.

Insurgent Cubans ask for an Armistice.

HALIFAX, April 4.—Tomorrow is to be a day of unusual developments in Chinese and Cuban questions.

Mr. Balfour has announced his intention to declare the government's new policy in the far east. Mr. McKinley has promised also that on Tuesday he will commit the Cuban question to congress to deal with. The two statements, one in Westminster about China, and one in Washington, about Cuba, will be under consideration at the same time.

The despatches indicate that Great Britain will depart from the integrity policy and take possession or proclaim a protectorate of some important territory that will maintain the balance of power.

The British-Chinese fleet has been ordered to assemble and it is reported that the British flag has been raised over the Chusan Archipelago.

A charge of accepting bribes from Russia is preferred against the Chinese Ministry. The Russians are accredited with distributing about 14,000,000 of dollars in this way.

Referring to the despatches regarding the Cuban situation on Friday the Spanish Torpedo Flotilla, incorrectly reported as having been at Porto Rico, is detained at Deverde Islands until joined by a more powerful escort.

A despatch from Havana says that the Autonomist Cabinet has addressed an appeal to the insurgents asking an armistice for the purpose of arriving at terms of peace.

## SENATORIAL APPOINTMENTS.

Mr. Yeo's Appointment Set Down for the 16th.

Commons Vacancy in Bagot.

OTTAWA, April 4.—A report from Toronto suggests the appointment of Rev. Dr. Dewar to the Senate, but Mr. W. H. Cook has still the inside track for the Ontario seat.

The appointment to the Prince Edward Island seat will probably be gazetted on Saturday, the 16th inst.

The Speaker's attention will soon be called to the vacancy in Bagot. The Opposition candidate is already selected, and it is believed that his election is certain.

## GREAT BRITAIN'S DEMAND.

China will Probably Concede.

LONDON, April 4.—The Pekin correspondent of The Telegraph says that England has demanded Wei-Hei Wei for the same period and the same terms as the Russian tenure of Port Arthur. It is expected that China will concede the demand.

## NEWS BY WIRE AND MAIL.

LONDON, March 31.—At a meeting of the Parnellite members in the house of commons today, John Redmond, the Parnellite leader, presiding, a resolution was adopted expressing "deep sympathy with the efforts of the people of America to secure the independence of Cuba, trusting that their efforts will be speedily crowned with success, to the benefit of humanity and the greater glory of the republic of America."

NEW YORK, March 31.—A despatch to the Herald from Barcelona says: "So far little attention has been paid by the local press to President McKinley's message, most of the papers contenting themselves with recording the bare fact that one had been presented to congress. At the same time the feeling that war is probable is apparent from the feverish way in which measures for protecting the Catalan coast and increasing the naval reserve force is discussed, subscriptions for these purposes being offered from all parts of Spain. The Dairio Del Comercio has a rousing editorial, calling upon the country to open its eyes, seeing that help from any European power is now out of the question and that Spain must, therefore prepare to rely upon her own internal strength."

NEW YORK, March 31.—George Clark Musgrove, the newspaper correspondent who has just been expelled from Cuba, represented the London Chronicle and the New York Journal. He recently visited the rebel lines and interviewed President Maso, of the Cuban republic, at the civil government headquarters in Camaguay, and made a thorough inspection of Calixto Garcia's patriot army of the east. The editor of the London Chronicle has appealed to the British foreign office for protection for Musgrove, who is a British subject. The British consul at Havana says that if the correspondent had been inside the rebel lines in defiance of government rules, he must expect little if any support from the British foreign office.
