reject such offers, and continue to freely donate blood in respect for their fellow citizens in times of need.

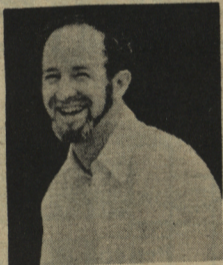
We do not, of course, wish to interfere in any way with the advertising policies of university publications, but we would hope that once knowing the full facts behind
