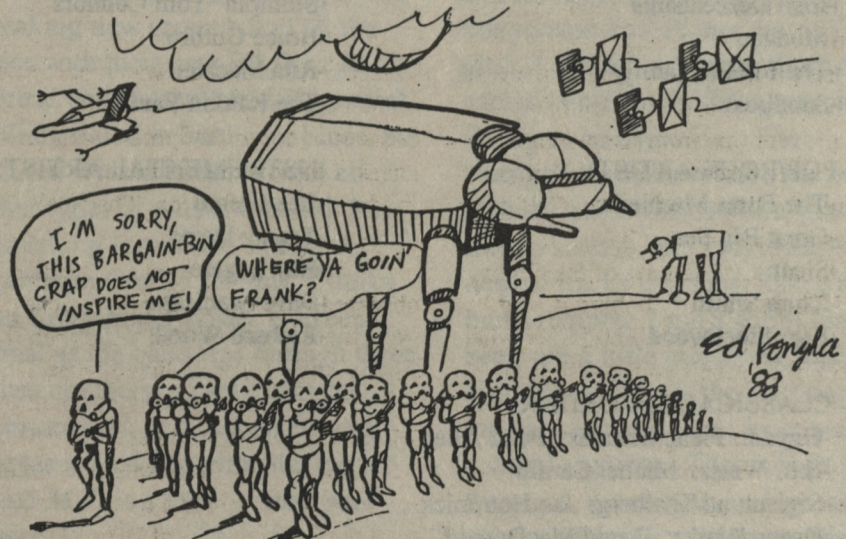
Thanks to all who attended the New Year's Eve event. It was a great time and a huge success. Be sure to watch for our upcoming events for winter carnival week.

# Acoustics Society Meeting

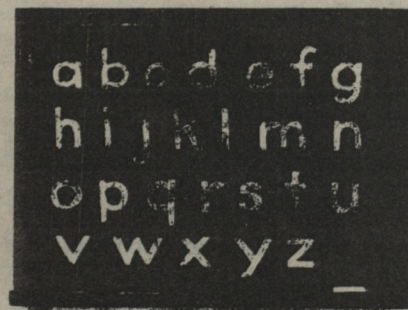
