OTTAWA, Sept. 6 — (Special) — Co-incident with the discussion in the Commons today of the new defence appropriation bill to meet Canada's expanded defence program and the Korean situation, the Treasury Board has instructed departments of the Federal Government to cut expenses sharply. It has also placed a ban on new civil projects for the duration of the current national emergency caused by aggression in Korea.
