Wanted — committee volunteers

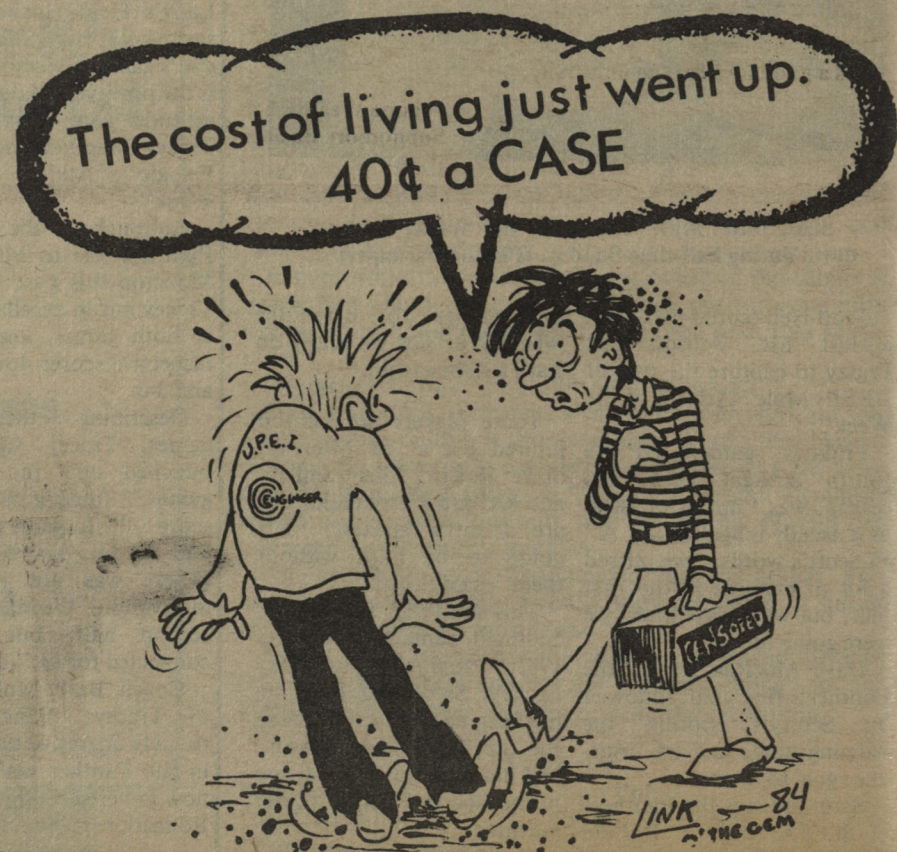
The Student Union is setting up a permanent file of names of students who want to sit on committees of this university.
