The ice cream social held in St. James United Church Hall on Saturday, July 28 was well attended. A generous helping of home

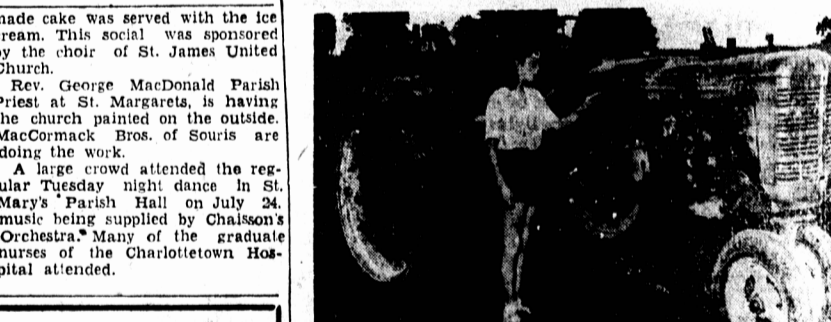
Shielding Child With Her Body, Mother Dies Under Tractor
