July 25 May Be Transfer Date

SUMMERSIDE—Premier Walter Shaw may ask Lt.-Gov. J. Macdonald to turn the reins of Prince Edward Island government over to Premier-elect Alex B. Campbell July 25, the young Liberal leader said Friday.

Mr. Campbell said in an interview he will meet with Mr. Shaw in Charlottetown Wednesday to discuss the date and details of the transfer of power.

The 42-year-old Summerside lawyer became the youngest man to be elected premier of a Canadian province in this century when Liberals took both seats in a Kings 1st deferred election last Monday. The victory gave the Liberals a 17-5 legislative majority and ended the seven-year administration of Mr. Shaw's Progressive Conservatives.

Mr. Campbell said he has been working on the formation of a cabinet and formal announcement of his ministers will follow shortly after the Lieutenant-governor's call to form the new government.

He said he is considering taking on the labor portfolio himself "because it requires the full-time attention of a legal mind." In any case, the labor ministry will be a separate portfolio, he said.

In the Conservative government, Dr. Hubert B. McNeil was welfare and labor minister.

Prime Edward Island is in throes of a transformation which not only includes jobs and wages but manpower training in a wide variety of fields as well as a complete review of the island's labor laws and regulations. Mr. Campbell said.
