BIG EXPLOSION AT HANG CHOU.

Three Thousand Chinese Soldiers

ARE SAID TO HAVE LOST THEIR LIVLS

By the Explosion of a Powder Magazine in Camp.

LONDON, Dec. 23.—A despatch from Shanghai says that a powder magazine, situated in the centre of the Chinese camp at Hang Chow, has exploded, and that a square mile of houses has been levelled.

It is estimated that 3,000 soldiers were killed, including the general commanding the forces. The American and French missions are both reported to have been damaged.

The Latter Day Saints.

NEW YORK, Dec. 20.—About 200 people attended a meeting of the woman's board of Home missions of the Presbyterian church today to take steps to prevent Brigham Roberts, of Utah, an avowed polygamist from taking his seat in congress. Eugene Young, a grandson of Brigham, was among the number.

A Great Strike.

SLOCAN CITY, B. C., Dec. 20.—The biggest and richest strike ever made in the Kootenay, and probably in British Columbia, was made in the Two Friends on Saturday. They are in near three feet of solid galena and sulphates and not half way through the ledge. The greatest excitement prevails there.

Connaught Will Go.

LONDON, Dec 20.—The Rome correspondent of the Daily Mail says he learns that the Duke of Connaught will go to Khar-toum as the representative of the Queen, to lay the foundation of the Gordon Memorial College, to be erected there under the direction of General Lord Kitchener for the instruction of Soudanese youth.

Stead's Peace Conference.

LONDON, Dec. 20.—The conference summoned by W. T. Stead to meet at St. James' hall in support of the Czar's peace rescript was attended by well known pacifists and clergymen. A number of letters from prominent men were read, among them one from Lord Rosebery, which was typical of the others. He said that he would welcome any efficient practical plan tending in favor of peace.
