## Soil Conservation

this one half ton during each cycle should be sufficient. On strongly acid land the first application may be increased to two tons per acre.

In the case of potato land, when the soil is strongly acid as indicated by the weak growth of clover, applications of 500 to 1,000 pounds of limestone per acre, one in each cycle of the rotation, may be sufficient and safe. The rate of application will depend, to some extent, on the length of the rotation.

Many of the Island soils are low in magnesium, and, therefore, dolomitic limestone is recommended.

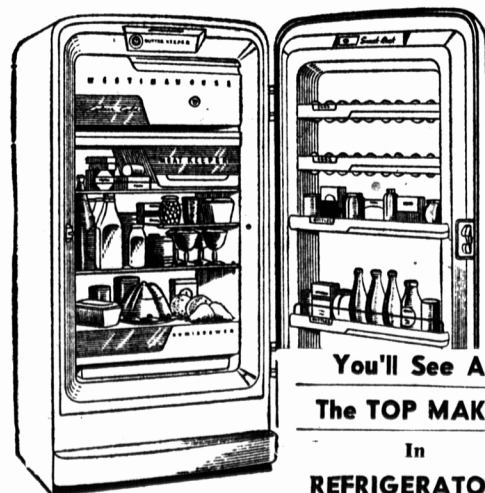
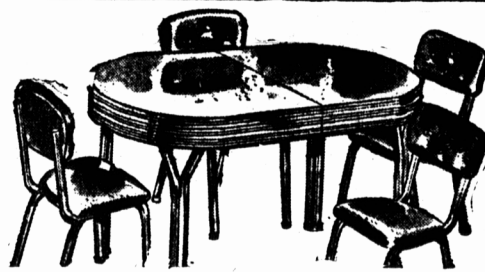

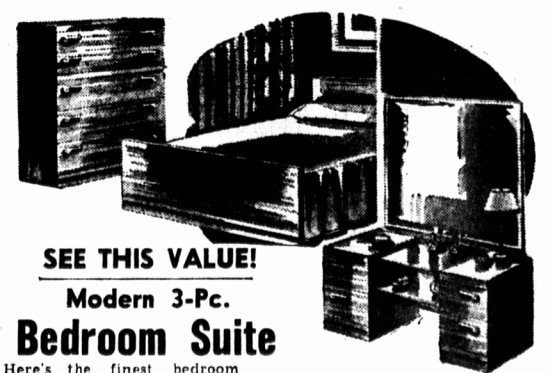
