## Highly-Manufactured Goods Should Feature In Exports

OTTAWA (CP)—A study of export projections for the period to 1970 says Canada should ship highly-manufactured goods abroad at a steadily expanding rate of 10 per cent a year.

The study, prepared for the Economic Council of Canada, also looks to increased exports of other non-agricultural products and tentatively to some slump in the rate of expansion of agricultural exports.

Highly-manufactured goods are those requiring a high degree of processing and usually a high labor outlay, as opposed to agricultural and other commodities which require little or no processing.

But the report, prepared by J. R. Downs as a background staff study paper for the council, says there may well be a healthy expansion of farm exports over what has been regarded in the past as average. These would be in the realm of grain sales to Communist countries, still difficult to forecast with any reasonable accuracy.

The study is based on the relation between Canadian exports and U.S. and world industrial production in the past, and the projections made by others for industrial production in the years ahead.

The organization for Economic Co-operation and Development—representing Japan, Canada and the U.S. and major west European countries—has set as a goal a 5.5-per-cent annual growth of industrial production.

The report says that in this context it is reasonable to project the growth of Canadian merchandise exports to \$8,000,000,000 in 1970 from \$6,900,000,000 in 1963. This is an average annual growth of 5.3 per cent for all exports, compared with a 4.4 per cent in the seven years to 1963.

But the report says the agricultural export projections are based only on what is known now of Communist-country import plans for this crop year and next.

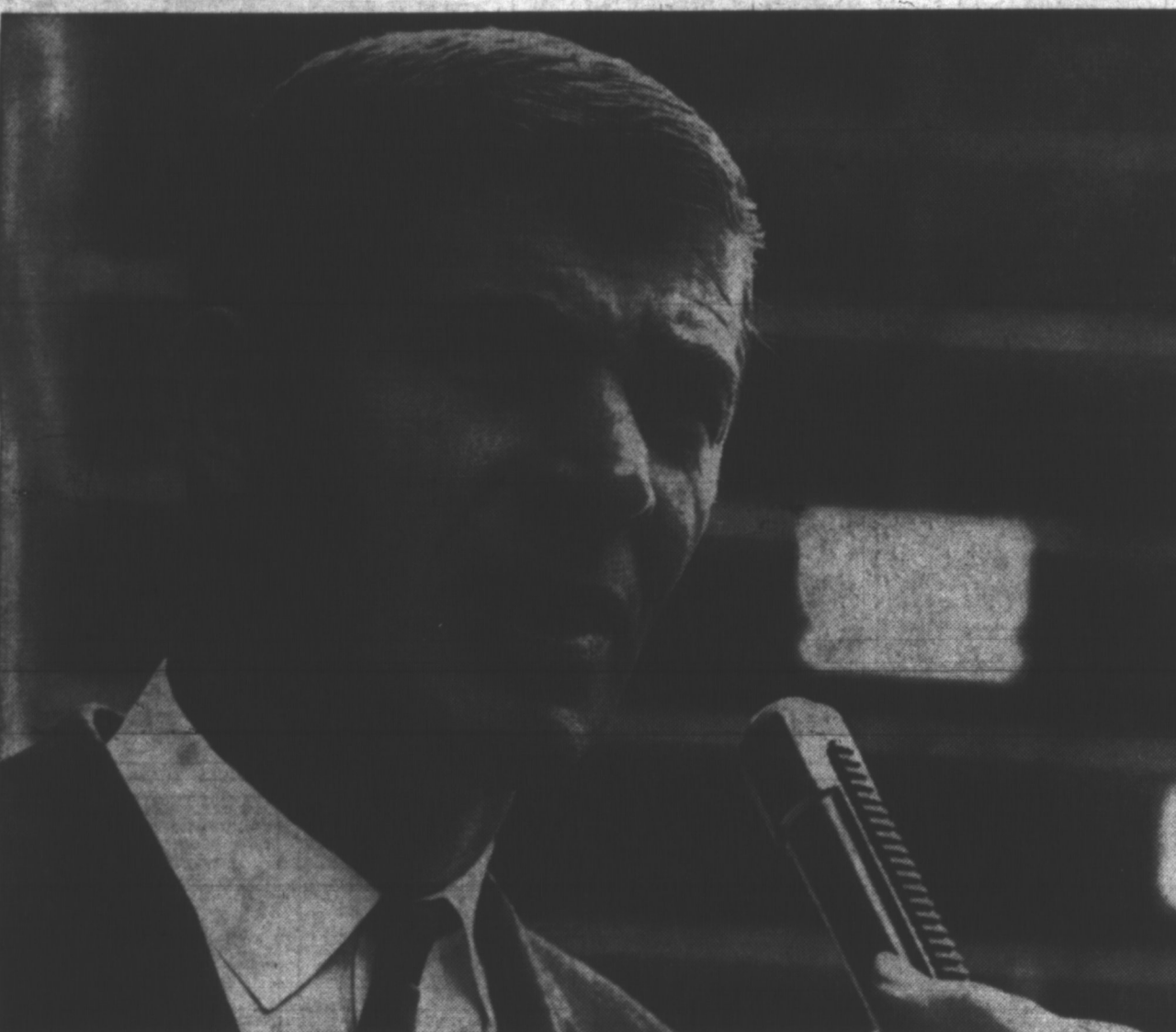
