## A PRESIDENT IN DANGER.

Attempted Shooting Prevented by Bystanders.

Some of Those Who Interfered Were Attacked and Wounded.

LONDON, Nov. 6.—Despatches from Rio Janeiro say that soldiers of the Tenth Battalion attempted to shoot President Morais. The bystanders frustrated the attempt, but Colonel Miras, the president's nephew was slightly wounded in disarming the soldiers. General Buteneour, Minister of War, then interferred and was himself stabbed. The wound was so serious that he died soon afterwards. The attack has caused the greatest agitation throughout the city.

### Benefits of Reciprocal Tariff.

OTTAWA, Nov. 6.—The admission of goods from Japan and Netherlands to the benefit of the reciprocal tariff made on the merits of the tariffs of the two countries is announced, bringing them in the same category as the United Kingdom, British India and New South Wales. They are on an entirely different category to those countries which came in solely on account of the "Favored Nation" clause.

### A Wall Street Dodge.

LONDON, Nov. 6.—The newspapers ridicule the resolution of the New York Chamber of Commerce urging the President to increase coast defenses. They called it a Wall Street dodge to send forces down.

### Fresh Appeal for Assistance.

LONDON, Nov. 6.—The Afridis have made a fresh appeal to the Ameer of Afghanistan for assistance before making submission to the British.

### Weyler to be Tried by Court Martial.

MADRID, Nov. 6.—Weyler will be tried by court martial for objectionable statements in the manifesto he recently issued.

## LATEST NEWS BY WIRE AND MAIL

LAGOS, West Coast of Africa, Nov. 4.—The French forces have evacuated Saki, one of the posts in the Lagos Hinterland which was occupied by their troops, in contravention, it is claimed here, of the Anglo-French agreement of 1889. So soon as it was announced that a French expedition had occupied Saki, Governor McCaullum, the British officer under whose jurisdiction the place is situated, despatched a force of British troops from Lagos to Saki. On the arrival of the British force near Saki the French troops retreated.

BERLIN, Nov. 4.—A despatch from Constantinople says the Porte, under threat from the Bulgaria government unless the promised terms to Bulgarian bishops in Macedonia should be granted before 10 o'clock Nov. 3, Bulgaria would declare independence, finally acceded to the demand and granted the terms.

QUEBEC, Nov. 4.—In usually well informed Liberal circles it is stated that P. A. Choquette, M. P. will be named Judge to replace Judge Billy and Carroll, M. P. for Kamouraska, will, at an early date, replace Sr Henri Joly de Lotiniere in the Cabinet. Mr. Tarte, it is believed, will be asked to replace Hon. Hector Fabre as commissioner at Paris, with probably an increase of salary.

HELENA, Mont., Nov. 4.—This morning a slight earthquake shock was felt here, rocking buildings. It was of seven seconds duration, but as yet no damage is known to have been caused by it.

WORCESTER, Mass., November 3.—Edward Hamilton, for twenty-five years an employe of the Worcester County Institution for savings, yesterday shot and killed his wife and one child, and fatally wounded another child. The murderer then shot himself with probably fatal results. The shooting occurred at Hamilton's residence. Hamilton had been in ill health for a few months past, and suffered from neuralgia. He had practically lived on opiates for a couple of weeks, and is supposed to have gone suddenly insane. The only witness of the tragedy was the servant employed in the Hamilton household. Mrs. Hamilton was in the room at the left facing the street, and was shot first. The bullet passed through her right temple, and must have killed her instantly. Mr. Hamilton then passed into the room where the baby girl was sleeping and shot her, and then went to the third room, the one at the extreme right, and shot the boy, wounding him fatally. Then he applied the weapon to his own head and fired. Only the four shots were fired.
