Dept. Store Sales Up 10%
OTTAWA (CP)—Department stores sold \$63,270,000 worth of goods in May, 10.1 per cent more than a year ago, the bureau of statistics reported Tuesday.

Sales for the first five months of the year totalled \$406,610,000, up 5.8 per cent over sales in the first five months of 1954.

Department store stocks at the end of April had an estimated sales value of \$264,270,000, up 4.2 per cent from a year earlier.

Sales increased in all regions, with largest gains in Quebec, up 15.8 per cent to \$17,995,000, and Ontario, up 12.2 per cent to \$30,968,000. The Atlantic provinces gained 11.2 per cent to \$3,314,000.

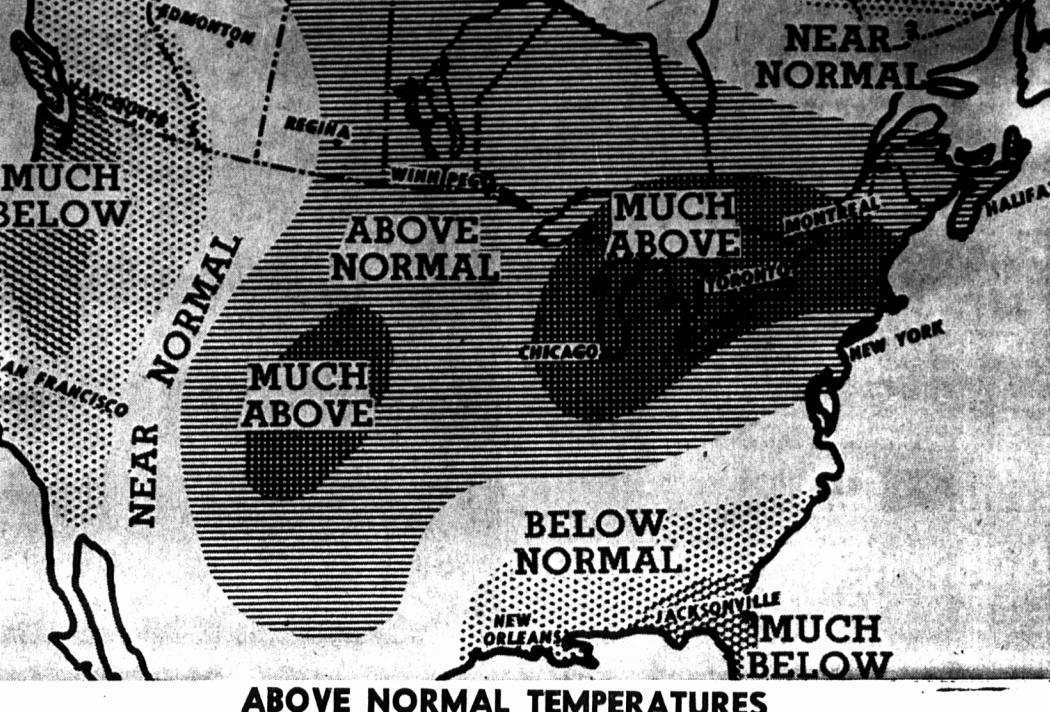

Inventory Down Shipments Up

OTTAWA (CP)—Manufacturers' inventory dropped and new orders rose in May, the bureau of statistics reported Tuesday.

Manufacturers' investment in inventory was \$3,516,000, a decrease of \$2,505,000 from April. Progress payment inventory—inventory held but not owned by manufacturers—also decreased by \$2,100,000 to \$540,800,000.

Shipment values increased 4.6 per cent from April and were 13.6 per cent higher than last year. Cumulative shipments for the first five months of the year were 4.6 per cent above the corresponding period of 1954.

Value of new orders increased 8.4 per cent from April and 16.5 per cent from May, 1954. Cumulative new orders for the first five months of 1955 were 8.5 per cent higher than during the corresponding period last year.
