many more years in the healing art.

Dr. Augustine MacDonald, representing King's County at the dinner, told of practising near Dr. Roddie for many years and of the high standard of medicine the guest maintained through the years. He also noted that in the days before the antibiotics when suffering could no longer be relieved the patient always received the wholehearted sympathy of his physician. He also recalled one morning when Dr. Roddie spryly arrived at the hospital in Souris to greet a new matron and heard her exclaim on his young manner and on being "such a lovely looking man." Dr. Roddie gallantly replied: "It's the mirror of your own countenance you see in my face, my dear."

Dr. Gus MacDonald took to the dinner several articles of interest to the profession including an ancient copper pestle brought to the Province by another Dr. Rod MacDonald in 1772. Dr. Harold Shaw, Association president, then read an illuminated address and presented the guest of honor with a large silver tray suitably engraved. In replying Dr. Roddie recalled the early years of medicine here and the handicaps under which physicians labored and recalled many of the tremendous advances he had been privileged to see.

Greetings were presented Dr. MacDonald by Dr. John McNeil, on behalf of the doctors of Prince county; Mayor J. D. Stewart from the City of Charlottetown; Dr. Selby, president of the Medical Alumni of the University of Toronto, and Dr. J. A. MacFarlane, Dean of the Medical School there; Dr. Clarence Routley, for the Canadian Medical Association; and from the Medical Societies of Nova Scotia and New Brunswick. The address to Dr. MacDonald is as follows:

"To Sir Roderick J. MacDonald, M.D. — The Prince Edward Island Division of the Canadian Medical Association at this memorable and historic meeting wish to extend to you our most sincere congratulations and best wishes.

"This is an occasion most memorable and unique and probably has not been duplicated in the long and glorious History of Medicine. Tonight this Island Medical Association wants to honor you, Sir, in your ninety-sixth year of life and sixty-sixth year of practice.

"We are not aware that a similar event has ever occurred in Medical History and we hereby claim not only a Provincial nor a Dominion record but a world record and you, Sir, are the veteran Medical Hero who makes this wonderful event possible. "You, Sir, are a splendid and outstanding example of a class of physicians who for years have been the heart and soul of the profession, the general practitioner or better known as the family doctor. "You have always been an honor to our profession and to this great Island. Your long and successful career is worthy of emulation and a glorious inspiration to your younger colleagues. Truly it can be said of you that you have always upheld the high ideals of our profession—Your ethics have always been unimpeachable and your relationship to your patients, to your colleagues, and to the public has never varied in its warmth and
