Arthur King Headed For Biggest Purse

TORONTO, May 30 — (CP) — L'il Arthur King returns to his home city for a battle with Armando Savio Monday.

He may get a shot at the world's lightweight title if he wins—but win, lose or draw, he'll likely get the biggest purse of his fistic career.

Promoter Frank Tunney predicts the gate may be as high as \$30,000.

King is the Toronto expatriate who would return to Canada from the United States to defeat his Canadian lightweight title and had it taken away.

that his Philadelphia stablemate, Ike Williams, no longer wears the laurels, depends immediately on Savio.

But the Montrealer who has stopped both Toronto lightweight leaders, Solly Cantor and Allan McFater, is a rough playmate.

Pete Audette, Savio's trainer, has announced that Savio will lay claim to the Canadian lightweight crown if he beats King.

Since heading for Philadelphia and the tutelage of manager Frank Palermo, King has had 31 bouts with only two losses.

Savio's record is equally impressive. In 52 fights, the Montrealer has dropped only four.

50 Million Order For B. C. Lumber

VANCOUVER, May 31 — (CP) — The British Columbia lumber industry got a \$50,000,000 order today from the British Timber Control.

Word was received from London that a new contract for the sale of 600,000,000 board feet has been negotiated by a group of B. C.

lumber men now in the United Kingdom.

Shipments will total about 50,000,000 feet a month, starting in July. Present contracts with Britain expire in June.

The price is slightly higher than last year, lumber men here said, but is still under the ruling world export market price.

No animal in the world, not even the dog and horse, enjoy such universal affection as the chimpanzee. An amazing fact about this animal is that its black hair does not whiten with age. The ape under human care shows a wonderfully quick intelligence, often surpassing the mentality of the human infant.

It likes to dress up and can be taught to drive an automobile, ride a bicycle after a few lessons, and do a number of other things reasonably well. The chimpanzee is capable of thinking things out for himself and couple cause with effect. If, for example, you hang a bunch of bananas high enough so as to be out of his reach, and place some boxes close by, the ape would get busy, place the boxes on top of each other until the fruit could be plucked with ease.

Besides bringing babies, it is a fact that the stork is of great benefit to man by reason of its insect diet, and in Holland actually saved that country from a serious flood prior to the building of dykes. In those days of reed dykes, insects relished by the storks used to nest in the reed dykes, destroying them and allowing the water to inundate the land. But, when the storks arrived, all was changed pronto!

Besides being the land of unique animals, Australia boasts a 328 mile railroad which crosses the Nullabor Desert that is as straight as an arrow.

But, if you are interested in pint-sized railroads, you'll find one in England (runs from Hythe to Dungeness). The tracks of this midget road are 15 inches wide, and the locomotives which ride them are only one quarter the size of standard engines.

The secretary bird, found over the greater part of Africa, is fully protected by law for the useful services it performs in ridding the country of snakes and vermin. The natives call it the "Vulture on Stilts," because of its long legs. The name "secretary" refers to the crest which, when closed, resembles pens in a pen holder.

Japan is the home of a strange creature which lays its eggs in a tiny sack, suspended from the bough of a tree overhanging water, with the lower end submerged. The larvae, when incubated, break through the sack and swim away. This strange creature belongs to the salamander family.

The lightest of all money was made of feathers woven into rope-like cords. This odd currency was used by the natives of the Island of Santa Cruz, one of the West Indies group.

Although well adapted to life in the water, the otter prefers land for its play, which consists mainly of sliding down clay banks, or, in winter, sliding over snow. They like to float on their backs, and the females, when foraging, leave their little ones floating like this among the sea-weed, which gives them almost perfect protection from their foes. When a sea otter catches a sea urchin, it then turns on its back, places the urchin upon its breast and kills it with a flat stone held between its bare paws
