Forty-line Graduates Receive Degrees Today



The largest class in the history of St. Dunstan's University will receive degrees today when the university holds its 108th Commencement exercises at the University gymnasium.

Chief Justice Thomas A. Campbell will give the address to the graduates and will also be one of three to receive an honorary degree. The others are Dr. A.A. MacDonald of Souris and Mother St. Francis Lopez.

The class valedictorian is Daniel O'Hanley, Monticello, an arts graduate.
