

Latest News Items.

All the nihilists tried in Russia for being implicated in plots against the life of the Czar have been found guilty. Five of them have been sentenced to death and eleven to hard labor in the mines, their terms of punishment ranging from life to fifty years penal servitude. The Court announced that it would intercede for the mitigation of the sentences in the cases of the women, and in the case of one of the men condemned to the mines.

After many years of struggle and difficulty, the Grand Trunk Railway of Canada seems to have entered upon a season of prosperity. At the half-yearly meeting held on the 28th ult., the President was able to announce that the gross receipts of the line for the half year ending in June last were £992,000, an increase of £159,000 over the same period in 1879. The working expense of the line were at the same time smaller, and the net profit for the half year was £337,248, which was the largest by £50,000 that it had ever earned in any half year.

Typhoid fever appears to be somewhat prevalent just now in a number of Canadian cities and towns. In some of these, the disease is distinctly traceable to an impure water supply; and we suppose, the impurity is caused by leakage from cesspools into wells, or by drainage from filth collections of one sort or another into streams or other sources of water supply. What a boon it would be to afflicted humanity if it could only be insured a full supply of pure water, pure air and an ample supply of sunlight; and yet how abundant and how common in most inhabited countries they all are. And what a fatal facility even civilized man has in shutting out light from his habitation, and in poisoning the air he breathes and the water he drinks. The sanitary age par excellence is no doubt coming, but very slowly.

A St. Petersburg correspondent sends the following:—"A political trial has just terminated at Charkoff, in which the majority of the accused were women, and the following sentences have been passed on the respective prisoners. The most important was Alexander Sytsenko, a doctor of medicine, and one Leckie. The remaining were all women, named Philipoff, Blinoff, Kusnetsoff, Daniloff, Golubeff. The first two were adjudged to be deprived of all civil rights and to hard labor in the mines for two years and eight months. (This involves perpetual exile in Siberia, none who are sent to the mines or prisoners there being allowed to return.) Of the females, Philipoff was sentenced to be deported to the government of Tobolsk for two years. (In these cases of simple deportation friends are allowed to accompany the exiles at their own expense, and a female, if well educated, can often find employment as governess in the families of the officials or residents.) Blinoff and Kusnetsoff were sentenced to imprisonment in a fortress for four months, Daniloff to four months imprisonment in an ordinary house of detention, and Golubeff to two months' imprisonment. Very few particulars of the trial have been published thus far—not even the precise charges brought against the accused are known here; but of course, they are charged with belonging to revolutionary associations, and probably some of them are charged with revolutionary propogands by circulating their secret publications.
