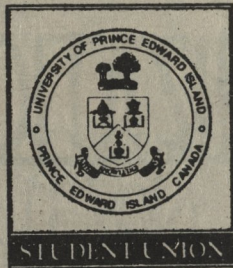

Pre-registration for full-time students for the Second Semester of 1990-1991 will take place from 13 November to 3 December. Pre-registration material will be available at the Registrar's Office, Kelley Building starting Tuesday, 13 November.

Students registering for English 101 (English Composition) are asked to choose three sections in order of preference. You will be notified only if you are not admitted to any one of the three sections you select. Please check with the Registrar's Office for your section allocation when signing in.

Also, students registering in English 101, 192, or other Arts courses with enrolment limitations as noted in the calendar are cautioned that they must attend no later than the second class or their names will be struck from the class lists.

The deadline for pre-registration will be Monday, 3 December. We regret that no pre-registration for either full-time or part-time students can be accepted after Monday, 3 December.
