NOTES AND COMMENTS.

—Canadian gold will glitter at the Paris exposition, but it will be in steel armoured cases. The gold specimens along with the other mineral exhibits have just been forwarded from the geological survey, and the cases which are now ready will be sent to the exposition without delay. It is estimated that there is at least 40,000 dollars worth of gold alone. This represents the wealth of the Pacific slope, the Yukon, Ontario, Quebec and the Maritime Provinces. The samples of gold and other precious metals will be exhibited on trays in steel cases, weighing 150 pounds, and built of strong steel bars. When not on exhibition these precious exhibits indicative of the wealth of Canada will be securely looked in a burglar-proof safe, and watchmen will guard exhibits night and day.

OBITUARY.

It is with deepest regret that we chronicle the death of Mr. Thomas Sigsworth, one of the oldest and most respected members of our community, which occurred at his home, Corra Ville, on Wednesday, the 21st of February, at the advanced age of eighty years.
