

# Premier Backs Dollar Policy In Souris Speech

**SOURIS** — Speaking at a Conservative rally here yesterday, Premier Walter R. Shaw said he deplored the action of the other provinces in attacking the pegging of the Canadian dollar.

He stressed the fact that even if Premier Edward George Peck had lowered the value of the dollar, it would mean more money for farmers and fishermen because a great deal of the produce was shipped to the United States. He noted that due to the provincial and federal governments working together the same produce was selling for higher prices than ever before.

**CO-OPERATION NEEDED**

"It is only through the continued cooperation of the provincial and federal governments that the local government could continue its expanded program on Prince Edward Island in regard to schools, adult education, and road paving."

Fisheries Minister J. Angus MacLean pointed out that in Kings County, 1,178 old age pensions have increased from \$6,000 to \$1,090,000; pensions for blind from \$6,000 to \$9,000; disabled pensions from \$12,000 to \$48,000. Veterans' allowances for the entire Island have increased from \$2,000,000 to over \$3,000,000, he said.

He said the general outlook for Prince Edward Island's fishing industry is very good and the market is excellent, especially in the United States. He noted that his department was looking for ways and means to increase the amount of fish produced, and the most important aspect of the fishing industry was the research department.

**INCREASED INCOME**

Mr. MacLean stated that a committee of experts and government ministers had been formed by the present government to look into the matter of increased production and income for people in rural areas across Canada. He said this was a project of the Conservative government and that it would be carried on to a greater extent in the future.

"The Liberal promises a recovery, but it is obvious that 22 years ago they were not started on the fulfillment of those promises. It is quite obvious that they are not going to get a better start. Even R. V. A. Winkie woke up after 20 years," Mr. MacLean said.

Other speakers included Hon. John R. MacLean, Mr. Mansel Macdonald, candidate for Kings; and Hon. Melvin MacQuaid, provincial treasurer. The meeting was chaired by Henry Mallard, Gowan Ross.

# 4 Men Arraigned On Charge Of Stolen Goods Possession

Four men pleaded not guilty to possession of stolen goods valued at more than \$50 before Magistrate A.J. Haslam in city police court yesterday. All were arraigned on June 21.

Maurice Williams, Ralph Weeks, Peter Elmer Doucette, all of Charlottetown, and Peter Hughes, Kelly's Cross, were charged with having possession of an overcoat, a raincoat and a sample case containing toiletry samples, perfume, Gordon Norrad, Sussex, N.B., and the Andrew Jenkins Co. Ltd. Perth, Ont.

Mr. Norrad, a commercial traveller, testified that he arrived in Charlottetown on June 22 and about 10:30 that night went to the United Services Officers Club with some friends. He said he left his car containing the coats and sample case, unlocked outside the club.

**FOUND ITEMS GONE**

He said that when he came out of the club about an hour later, the items had been stolen. He was later taken to police headquarters to identify the items, which had been recovered by police.

The case of James Bruce, New Argyle, charged with stealing money in excess of \$50 from Athol Ellis, was remanded to June 28.

A prominent Montague businessman, L.H. Poole, died early yesterday in the Prince Edward Hospital. He had been in failing health for several years but had entered hospital only a few days ago. He was 64.

A member of the firm of Poole and Beer in Montague, Mr. Poole was a produce shipper for many years and participated in many community activities.

He was a prominent supporter of the board of trade and was one of the province's keenest sporting supporters.

**ACTIVE LIBERAL**

A lifelong Liberal, he had been active in party organizations for many years and was a former president of the Kings County Liberal Association.

He is survived by his widow, the former Olive Robertson from Mount Hope, and the following sisters and brothers: Mrs. Edward Hazen, (Greta), Regina; Mrs. George Schurman, (Ded), Yarmouth, N.S.; and Mrs. Floyd Flax (Edween), Rutland, Vermont; Mrs. S.M. MacLean (Sue), and George Poole, Montague, who is a retired branch manager of the Bank of Nova Scotia.

Three brothers, who preceded him, were Richard, John and Herb.

The funeral will be held from Trinity United Church, Montague, on Saturday at 1:30 p.m. Interment will be in the Montague cemetery.

# Tobacco Crop Not Affected By Tuesday's Low Readings

No frost damage to tobacco plants has been reported thus far from Tuesday night's temperatures, which went as low as 24 degrees at ground level at the Experimental Farm here, with slightly warmer temperatures at several other recorded spots in the province.

No plants were killed on the Experimental Farm plots at Pleasant Grove or Upper Montague, it was learned yesterday from Research Officer Keith LeLachour, although there was some "burning" in one part of the Pleasant Grove plot.

**28 DEGREES**

A temperature of 28 degrees was recorded at Pleasant Grove not far from the tobacco plot, though Mr. LeLachour said he was not sure how accurate the thermometer is.

The Upper Montague location is on the tobacco farm of Marcel Moyal, who also reports no damage and there was none either, it was learned, on the government's farm at Greenwood.

The Guardian-Patriot's Montague bureau yesterday reported no damage at all in that area and the Alberton bureau said yesterday there has been no damage on the tobacco acreage owned by Leigh O'Brien, Alberton and Frank Shea, St. Louis.

# Enheat Plant Is Expecting First 'Lank'

The first of the Lancaster hours to be overhauled at the Enheat and Heating Products Ltd. will arrive Saturday or Sunday, an Enheat spokesman said yesterday.

The planes are to be overhauled and modified for research use in the Canadian North. The overhaul process is expected to be completed in about two months.

Most of the equipment required for the overhaul has already arrived, the spokesman said. While no staff increase is expected during the initial stages of the overhaul, additions to the staff are anticipated as the work progresses.

Six or seven more planes are expected to follow, and the whole overhauling process is to be completed by the end of 1963.

# Warning Lights' High Cost Disapproved By Kensington

**KENSINGTON** — At a meeting of Kensington Town Council Tuesday night, the members expressed disapproval of the high estimated cost of the town's share of installation of warning lights on the three railway crossings in the town.

The town's estimated portion of the cost would be \$5,300 for annual maintenance expenses. Keith Harrington, M.L.A. had earlier announced that government assistance would be supplied for installation only, but the town still feels that installation and maintenance costs would be too high for the town's present revenue.

A letter was read from Dr. Orville Phillips, M.P., stating that word had been received that plans are being formulated for the requested improvements to the CNR property in Kensington. Planning was one improvement listed in the letter.

Joseph MacGregor was granted a building permit for the erection of a residence on Malpas Road.

Coun. Chester MacKay was appointed to prepare a permit form dealing with certain parties desiring to locate mobile homes in the town.

A letter was read from the Kensington Area Board of Trade thanking the town for the cooperation received in assisting the board to establish a tourist information and handicraft display centre. Especially mentioned in the letter was the council's decision to rent rooms in the old town hall for a nominal fee.

The tourist and handicraft displays will be located there.
