MONTREAL

MONTREAL (CP) - Industrials scored a good gain on the Montreal and Canadian stock exchanges Tuesday. Continued industrial volume exceedingly active.

Some gains ranged to more than a point and several new highs were reached. The advance was shared by the steels, papers, base metals and constructions. The utilities and refining oils were irregularly higher while the textiles and foods were unchanged. Banks and beverages were steady.

Assay common closed at 14 1/4, up 1/4, after touching 14 1/2, a new high. The preferred gained 7/8 at 14 1/2. The company has improved first quarter earnings and several brokers have recommended the stock.

Avro lost 1/4 at 10 1/4. In the pipelines, Trans Mountain lost 1/2 at 12 1/2. Gainers included Stelco, up 1/4 at 7 1/2, Nickel, up 1/4 at 90 3/4, Bell up 1/4 at 4 1/2, and BC Phone, up 1/4 at 45 1/2. Bell and BC Phone were at new highs.

Trading in the mines and oils was moderately active and prices were irregularly higher. The closing averages show the banks up 1/4 at 61 1/4, utilities up 1/4 at 154 1/2, industrials up 1 1/2 at 316 3/4, a new high, combined up 1 1/2 at 262 1/4, a new high, papers up 3/4 at 488 1/2 and golds off .17 at 89 1/2.

NEW YORK

NEW YORK (AP) - The stock market hurdled some profit-taking and chalked up another record high on average Tuesday. A few stocks made wide gains, among them Thiokol, up 9/16 to 12 1/2, and Zenith, up 9/16 to 20 1/2.

Kenecott started with a gain of 3/8 amid a generally higher copper group, aided by a 1/2-cent price boost for a red metal at the custom smelter level.

Coppers and chemicals were the sturdiest gainers. Tobaccoes as well as an assortment of air-crafts, electronics and electrical equipments also rose. Oils were weak. Rails, though spotty, were up on average. Rubbers, drugs and building materials were mixed.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks rose 70 cents to a record \$221.60. International Nickel rose 1/4, Distillers Seagrams 3/4, Granby Mining 1/4 and Canadian Pacific, Hudson Bay Mining and Walker Gooderham 1/4. Aluminium Ltd. lost 1/4, McIntyre Porcupine 1/4 and Dome Mines 1/4.

Among Canadian stocks on the American exchange, Brazilian Traction and Canadian Marconi rose 1/4, Shawinigan 1/4 and Preston East Dome, Jupiter Oils and Sapphire Petroleum 1-16. Scurry Rainbow Oil lost 1/4, Fargo Oil 1/4 and Molybdenite 1-16.

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TORONTO

TORONTO (CP) - The stock market recorded its best advance in two weeks Tuesday as trading reached the fastest pace since Feb. 2. On index, base metals, boosted by a strong copper group, gained three-quarters while golds were

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up one-quarter. Western oils slipped off more than one-half after opening narrowly ahead. Final volume was 4,540,000 shares, well above Monday's 2,822,000. Speculative mines had their best run in three weeks. Consolidated Halliwell was the most active, trading 363,000. It gained 4 cents at \$1.01. All five of the most active mines gained.

International Nickel and Hudson Bay each were up 1/4 to lead base metals. In golds, Bralorne added 40 cents at \$1.35 1/2. Kerr-Addison was up 1/4 at 19 1/2. Campbell Red Lake, however, dipped 1/4 at 11 1/4.

Home Oil lost 1/4 at 18 1/4. The section was generally mixed. Petrol dipped 19 cents at \$1.88 among lower-priced oils. Index changes: Golds up 25 to 92.05; base metals up .72 to 185.20; western oils off 62 to 141.46.

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P.M. Salutes Half Million In Rotary International

In a salute to Rotary International and to nearly half a million Rotarians throughout the world who this week are observing the 54th anniversary of the founding of the first Rotary Club, Prime Minister Diefenbaker said: "I want to say how much I recognize and realize the contributions made by Rotary to international affairs, in particular bringing together the representatives of various races and nations to a degree that is phenomenal in its numbers and tremendous in its contributions."

Rotary soon became a strong factor in the promotion of many different types of community betterment activities, for work with handicapped children and for the promotion of high standards in business and professional practice. As the Rotary ideals of friendship and service to others spread from country to country, Rotary became a potent force for the development of international understanding, good will and peace, not only among its own members, but among all the people of the world and this is now one of the major fields of Rotary's continuing activity.

Nearly four hundred clubs were organized last year in some fifty countries. Four new countries were added to the Rotary Roster: French Guiana in South America, Ghana in Africa, Laos in Asia and Madagascar in the Indian Ocean—bringing the total number of countries in which there are Rotary clubs to one hundred and eleven.

Rotary in Charlottetown is just one unit in a chain of more than ten thousand Rotary clubs with a total membership slightly under half a million. When the first Rotary club was organized in Chicago shortly after the turn of the century by a young lawyer named Paul Harris, its main

purpose was the promotion of fellowship and understanding among the business and professional men of that city. INTERNATIONAL Rotary soon became a strong factor in the promotion of many different types of community betterment activities, for work with handicapped children and for the promotion of high standards in business and professional practice. As the Rotary ideals of friendship and service to others spread from country to country, Rotary became a potent force for the development of international understanding, good will and peace, not only among its own members, but among all the people of the world and this is now one of the major fields of Rotary's continuing activity.

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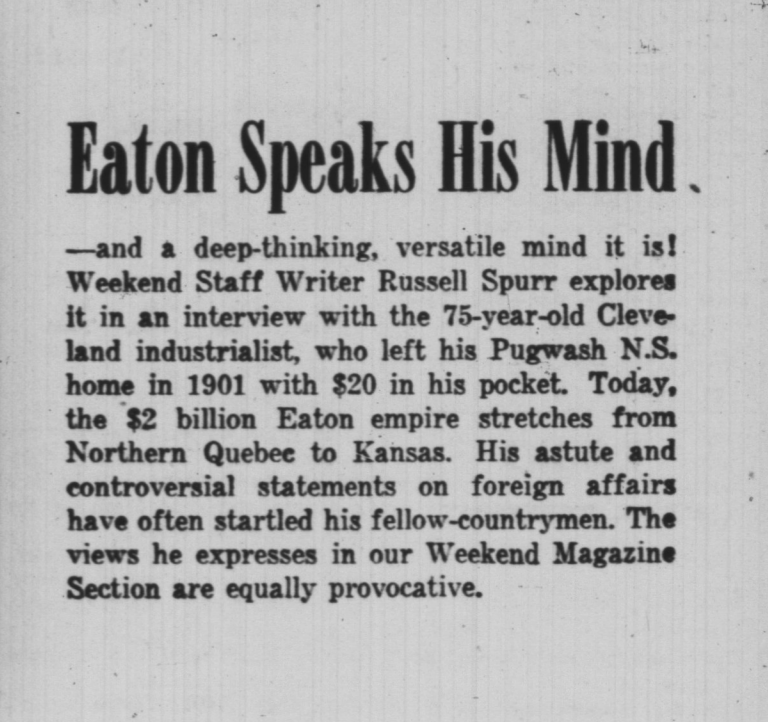


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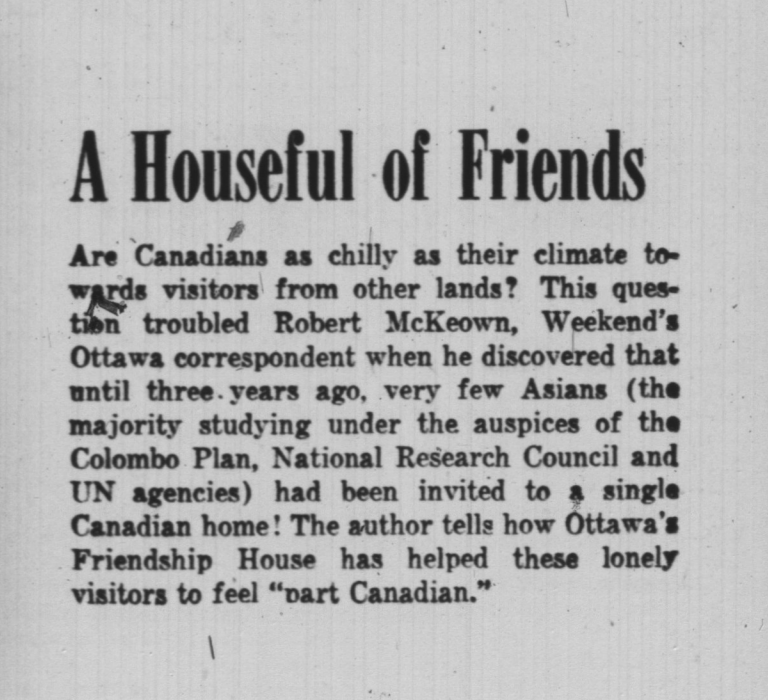


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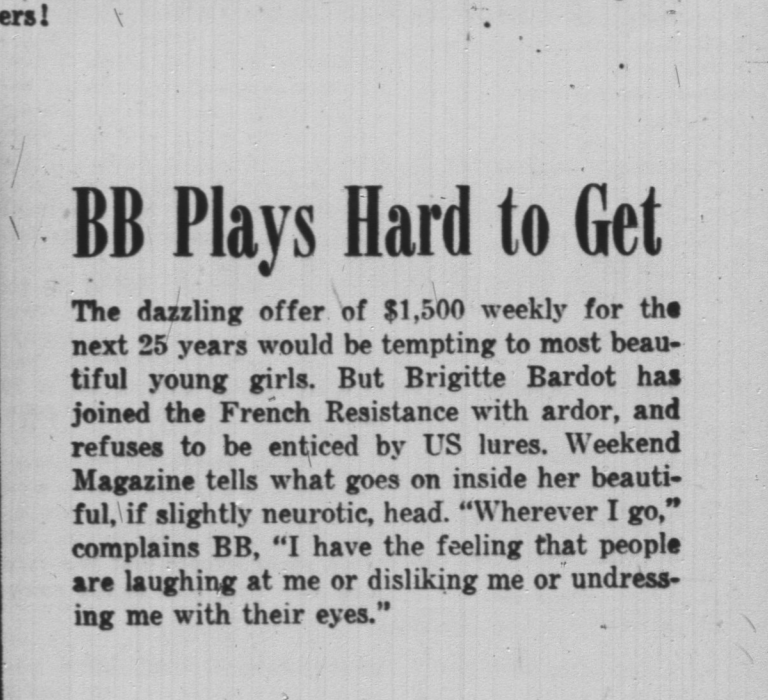
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
