OTTAWA, Dec. 11.—From present appearances the extension of the Intercolonial railway to Montreal will certainly not take place until January.

Hon. Mr. Langelier's revolt is the reigning sensation here.

The Premier was asked if he had seen Langelier's interview. He replied in the affirmative. On being asked if he had anything to say about it, he replied: "Not a word. I am not in the habit of discussing before the public questions which only concern the internal economy of the party. I will not depart from this rule."

**Edward Blake Criticised.**

TORONTO, Dec. 11.—The Evening Telegram's London cable says that there is considerable criticism there of a paragraph in the Hon. Edward Blake's speech in which he said that "after confederation England relied on Canada to defend herself." It is said there is no truth in this.

**He Wants a Railway.**

PIERREVILLE, Que., Dec. 11.—Jules Alard, the Liberal candidate in Yamaska for the Legislature, left for Quebec to insist that the government shall grant a subsidy to the South Shore railway. Unless it does this Alard will retire and let the county go by default to the Conservatives.

NEW YORK, Dec. 11.—In the great bicycle race now on here Miller still retains his lead of nearly a hundred miles. Rivierre has retired, out of his mind. The physical condition of Moore is also out, he having received a bad fall.

The legislation in question was a radical one, and a number of druggists throughout the province have been convicted and fined for infractions of it.

TORONTO, Dec. 9.—The Northwest Land Company's sales of land for November were 6,000 acres for \$30,000, against 3,000 acres in November last year for \$16,000. The sales for the eleven months this year are 18,000 acres over the same time last year, giving an increase in revenue for 1897, of \$100,000. The amount of stock cancelled by the company for eleven months this year is \$43,000 more than the same time last year.

WESSON, Miss., Dec. 9.—The wife and four children of Brown Smith, a planter living in Simpson county, 20 miles from here, were murdered last night, while a fifth child was terribly injured. Mr. Smith, who is a son of ex-representative Edward Smith, went to a near by town yesterday afternoon, leaving his family at home. This morning, when he returned, he found his wife and five children weltering in their blood apparently all dead. An alarm was raised and the entire neighborhood turned out to hunt for the perpetrators of the crime. There being no telegraph connections, details of the crime came in slowly, but it is reported this evening that one of the little girls, supposed this morning to have been killed, has revived enough to tell what she knew of the occurrence. She said that she knew the man who committed the deed; that it was a negro and she described him. A posse is now on the track of the murderer and there is great probability that he will be apprehended before morning and there can be but little doubt that he will be lynched when caught.

Sheriff McNair, of Lincoln, and Thompson, of Copia counties, have gone to the scene of the crime with a pack of trained bloodhounds.

LACHINE RAPIDS, Dec. 9.—The frazil ice is running freely in the river, and is being diverted from the Hydraulic Works by the dams and overflow provided for the purpose, which seems to work to a charm and fulfill the highest expectations of the designers.

KIEL, December 9.—The German cruiser Geier sailed for the West Indies today. The other warships here bid her an enthusiastic farewell. The Geier is a third-class cruiser of 1,706 tons displacement. Her armor-plated deck is three inches in thickness and she carries eight 4.1 inch quick-firing guns, seven smaller rapid firing guns, and has two torpedo tubes.

WINNIPEG, December 9.—Archbishop Lang-vin, of St. Boniface, was a speaker at the special services in connection with the Feast of the Immaculate Conception held at St. Mary's church yesterday. Referring to the school question His Grace said: "I want you to go back to your homes with a word of hope. I want you to understand that your archbishop has just the same dispositions as he had before. I want to tell you that I am hopeful, and more hopeful than ever for a great cause, a most important cause, a cause of life and death to us, the cause of our Catholic schools. You may pray that we may triumph over our adversaries. The politicians and the newspapers make claims from day to day, in which to bury our schools, but these claims will surely be used, not for this purpose, but for many of those who prepared them. They may bury it in the papers, but they will not, can not, succeed in burying the question as they would like to, because it is an impossibility for to do so they must first bury national law, then justice, then the constitution, and not until they have done all this may they expect to attend the funeral of our schools. Wait for a word from Rome, and from there who represent the supreme authority will get you and be hopeful."
