Large Dams Underway on Manicouagan River

By GERRY MCNEIL. BAIZ COMEAU, Que. (CP) — Engineers describe it as the largest hydro-electric project but-tressed, multiple-arch dam. The description becomes even more impressive when they add that Montreal's 45-storey Place Ville Marie would fit comfortably inside the dam.

of hydro-electric resources in the province. The Quebec government's position on the matter is not yet clear but the private companies are strongly opposing nationalization.

Meantime, cement and concrete trucks roll north from this busy port in an endless stream into the Manicouagan wilderness, where the government forecasts will be a four-stage paradise like the Shasta Dam area of California.

Some \$18,000,000 worth of construction equipment is assembled at the site, 60 miles northeast of Montreal.

Next spring, trucks will begin dumping 1,000,000 cubic yards of concrete to build the wall to a height of 450 feet and allow the reservoir to start filling up.

It will take several years to complete the dam, bringing it to its full height of 750 feet, but it will be another eight years before the reservoir covers its full 800 square miles.

Yet Manicouagan, the big job it knows here, is no more than the key project in the \$2,000,000,000 Manicouagan-Outardes hydro-electric power development.

It is possibly the biggest construction job under way in the world.

Manicouagan will be the fourth greatest dam in the world when completed and easily the greatest in North America. It's reservoir will be four times larger than that of the Hoover Dam, previous North American hydro-electric giant.

And it still will be only one of five large dams, a network that will provide 6,000,000 horsepower. Canada's present total output is 25,000,000 horsepower.

Three dams and boilers built on the mighty Manicouagan, which has a watershed of 17,500 square miles, Indians originally named it "good place to get a drink."

Two more will be built on the Outardes, which runs parallel through almost virgin land north of here into the Gulf of St. Lawrence nearby.

QUEBEC-HYDRO JOB The job is being done by the public-owned Quebec Hydro-Electric Commission, which since 1960 has been charged with harnessing all new hydro-electric resources.

Transmission lines from the Manicouagan will stretch across Quebec by 1970 to power-bungry cities and industries. Quebec Hydro spokesmen say the province may be able to sell more power to Ontario and New York State as a result.

Much of the energy will be sold to private power companies. If there are any left by the time the Manicouagan-Outardes project is completed in 10 to 12 years.

Natural Resources Minister Rene Levesque has made it known he would like to see nationalization of these companies to allow organized defence.

Damage In Man. Heavy From Hail WINNIPEG (CP) — The hail-stone ravage of recent weeks across Manitoba could leave in its wake a near-record crop loss, a hail insurance company spokesman said here.

M. W. Davy, branch manager of Co-operative Hail Insurance Company said more than 1,000 claims have already been filed and the harvest is barely underway. This number of claims he said is "much higher than average."

He said the company, which handles about one-third of all private crop hail insurance in Manitoba, estimates its loss at tentative \$50,000.

This figure is higher than the company's actual indemnity payments in 1958, referred to as the worst hail year in Manitoba history. Agriculture department figures show that more than 500,000 crop acres were partially or totally destroyed in 1956 in Manitoba.
