NEW YORK (AP)—The stock market put on a surprising show Friday, rallying in late trading to score its fourth straight advance.
Little had been expected of the market in advance of the three-day fourth of July weekend. The market will be closed Monday.

In the final hour of trading, many key issues rang up good gains.
Although it had a huge gain under its belt from the previous three days, the market ignored such negative signs as a drop in the U.S. gold reserves to lowest level since October 1938, a rise in unemployment in June and a drop in factory bookings in May.

The Dow Jones average of 30 Industrials rose 3.57 to 875.16. The Associated Press 60-stock average advanced 1.4 to 321.1. Volume fell to 4,260,000 shares from 4,520,000 Thursday.

General Motors advanced 1 1/2 to 98 1/2. American Telephone at 68 1/2 and Ford Motor 4 1/2 at 53 1/2.

Among Canadian issues, Dome Mines jumped 1/2. Distillers Seagrams, Canadian Pacific, McIntyre Porcupine and Walker Godehard 1/2 each and both Aluminium Ltd. and Hudson Bay Mining 1/2.

Prices advanced on the American Stock Exchange. Brazilian Traction, Canadian Marconi, Preston and Fargo Oil all gained 1/2. Scurry Rain-forest Oil slipped 1/2.

Total volume was 1,855,000 shares compared with 2,703,000 shares traded Wednesday and was last lower Aug. 22, 1963, when a total of 1,802,000 shares changed hands.

In the main list, Texaco and Levy Industries each gained 1/2 to 49 1/2 and 14 1/2, and Price Brothers 1/2 to 40. Stelco, Domtar and Calgary Power each topped on 1/2 at 28 1/2, 20 and 20 1/2, respectively.

Burns gained 1/2 to 25 1/2, and Harding Carpal rose 1/2 to 29. Moore Corp. rose 1/2 to 70 1/2, and Interprovincial Pipe 1/2 to 91 1/2. Bell Telephone, Canada Iron Foundries and Chemcell each advanced 1/2 to 59 1/2, 50 and 18, respectively.

BASE METALS ADVANCE
Senior base metals bounced ahead. Mattagami Lake rose 1/2 to 17 and Hudson Bay 1/2 to 69. Inco tacked on 1/2 to 41 1/2. Noranda rose 1/2 to 43 1/2.

Gold was higher with Kerr Addison up 10 cents to 88 1/2 and McIntyre Porcupine ahead 1/2 to 78.

Senior western oils advanced with Canadian Superior up 1/2 to 20 1/2 and Central-Del Rio and Home A each ahead 1/2 to 11 1/2, and 17 1/2. Dome fell 1/2 to 10 1/2.

On index, Industrials rose 1 1/2 to 164.40, the Toronto-Steel exchange index 1.06 to 154.32, golds 1.16 to 159.42, base metals 7.4 to 76.46 and western oils .60 to 99.14.
