SPECIAL GENERAL MEETING OF THE COMPANY Notice is hereby given that a Special General Meeting of the Sun Life Assurance Company of Canada will be held in the Assembly Hall on the Seventh Floor of the Company's Head Office, 1155 Metcalfe Street, Montreal, Canada, at 2:30 p.m. on Tuesday, May 6th, 1958.

Special By-law "D" (1) This by-law shall not become effective until sanctioned by the Treasury Board of the Government of Canada and on such sanction the Company, for the purposes of Section 90A of the Canadian and British Insurance Companies Act, shall exercise the powers therein conferred to purchase shares of the capital stock of the Company, subject to the terms and conditions of the Act and of this by-law.

(2) The date set for the commencement of purchase of shares shall be the fifteenth day of May, 1958, or the day following the day this by-law is sanctioned by the Treasury Board, whichever day is the later, and no shares shall be purchased by the Company prior to this date.

(3) The directors, by resolution, shall fix a price per share to be paid by the Company for the purchase of shares and shall submit this price together with this by-law to the Treasury Board and if the Treasury Board is satisfied, as required by the Canadian and British Insurance Companies Act, that the price fixed is fair and reasonable in the circumstances and sanctions this by-law this price shall be the price to be paid by the Company for shares purchased by it and this price shall not be changed without the approval of the Minister of Finance for Canada.

(4) A register shall be kept giving particulars of offers for sale of shares received by the Company and the price to be paid for shares purchased by the Company shall be the fixed price in effect the day the offer for sale was received at the Head Office of the Company or the day set for the commencement of purchase of shares, whichever date is the later.

(5) The Company shall purchase all shares offered for sale under the terms hereof but if at any particular time by reason of the limitations imposed by the Canadian and British Insurance Companies Act the amount available for the purchase of shares is insufficient to purchase immediately all the shares offered for sale, the amount available shall be applied in approximately equal proportions among the shareholdings offered for sale, but in calculating the proportions there shall be no splitting of shares, and the offer for sale of any shares not purchased shall remain in effect and maintain its place on the register unless and until withdrawn by the shareholder by notice in writing to the Company.

(6) All shares purchased by the Company shall be paid for in cash by the Company in full at the time of purchase but if the seller of the shares so requests the Company may agree to make payment in whole or in part by promissory note of the Company payable at the fixed or determinable future time not later than ten years from the date of the making thereof and bearing a rate of interest fixed by the directors and approved by the Minister of Finance for Canada.

(7) The voting rights attributable to the shares purchased by the Company shall be exercised by such one of the policyholders as is designated by a majority of the policyholders' directors. The Board of Directors has fixed a price of \$25 per share for the purchase of shares, subject to the approval of the Treasury Board of Canada.

Every person who has contracted with the Company for a participating policy, and who holds such a policy upon which no premiums are due, is a member of the Company and is entitled to attend and to vote in person or by proxy at general meetings of the Company, deemed the proposals to be fair and equitable, intend to vote the policyholders' proxies they now hold in favour of the confirmation of the By-law. Any policyholder who qualifies as a member may obtain a blank form of proxy on request therefor in writing to the Secretary of the Company.

The proxy of a policyholder must himself be a qualified policyholder and entitled to vote, and to be valid an instrument of proxy must be filed with the Secretary of the Company prior to April 26th, 1958.

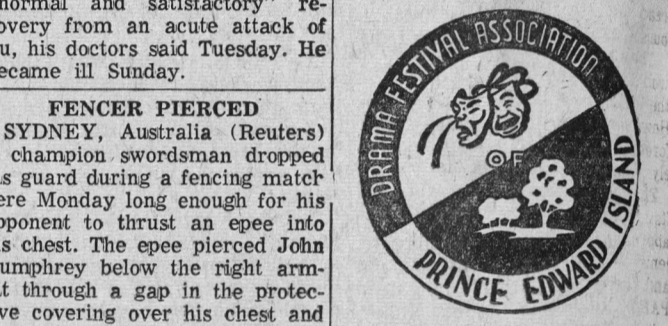
