Old Nfld Copper Mine To Produce

GULL POND, Nfld. (CP) — A copper mine that made a false start half a century ago is being reamed out and readied to begin ore production next spring.

Mine boss T. E. Swanson and a 75-man crew are driving a three-compartment shaft into the mineral rock. The 250-foot level was the target for October and by February the miners hope to have the shaft completed at 750 feet.

Gull Pond is in central Newfoundland 20 miles from the sea at Hall's Bay, and 50 miles from the north shore development of Tilt Cove where another mine is being prepared with an expected production of 3,000 tons a day.

At the Gullbridge mine Mr. Swanson says "we have been talking vaguely of a 1,000-ton-per-day plant for some time but you can change from a 1,000 to a 2,000-ton mill with very little change in floor space. We don't know how big this mine may become because we have not yet examined the ore body except by drilling."

ORE UNDER LAKE

Present plans are to start mining all 1,000 tons a day to be doubled if the ore proves of good grade and market conditions warrant. Ore stockpiling will begin next spring but full production is not expected until a year or 18 months from now.

Diamond drilling is said to indicate at least 2,000,000 tons of ore running more than two per cent copper, with a higher percentage in some samples. Several smaller bodies also exist, all the ore lying under Gull Lake. Outcroppings on the lake bottom may lead to an arm of the lake being drained sometime in the future.

Power is supplied at present by diesel generators but a 60-foot fall on South Brook, eight miles distant, may be the site of hydro development.

The mine and mill are expected to employ 400 or 500 men, and townsites plans are tentative.

Copper was discovered here in 1905 and in 1918, when the copper boom was near collapse, a 75-foot shaft was sunk on the rim of the pond and a 68-foot exploratory tunnel run out. The area was drilled again in 1922 and 1928, then left to the wilderness until the present government began its mineral development policy after Confederation in 1949.

Solids More Important Than Fats In Milk, Nutritionist

QUEBEC (CP) — Canada's \$1,000,000,000 dairy industry was told by a top federal nutritionist to modify the age-old emphasis on the fat content in milk and direct more attention to the value of milk solids.

Dr. L. B. Pett, chief of the health department's nutrition division, told the National Dairy Council that in his opinion the medical profession has not yet fully established its case linking fats to arterial heart disease.

In nutrition, milk was still tops among foods, but the value was in milk solids and not the fat.

"This is a hard fact for the dairy industry to accept because the false idea that the fat content of milk indicates the value has such a long history.

"It has influenced breeding habits on dairy farms and methods of payment and even legislation in a way that will be hard to change. But I believe this emphasis on fat content must be changed."

Dr. Pett spoke against a backdrop of deepening dairy concern over the way the scientists have been attacking the health value of fats. Years of struggle have gone into the development of dairy herds producing milk with high butterfat content.

DEBATE HARMFUL
Grant M. Carlyle of Calgary, council president, told the annual sessions Wednesday that the buttermilk controversy was a "pregnant with harmful possibilities" than other single issue facing the industry.

"And yet no single issue is more difficult to discuss in public because so much evidence is inconclusive," he said.

Dr. Pett agreed the situation was discouraging. Physicians who for years were ardent supporters of the dairy industry now were telling people not to use milk, ice cream or other dairy products.

"I am bound to say," he added, "that these attacks on dairy products are likely to continue for some time and are almost certain to influence consumption unfavorably, although I believe that in the end the full fact will not be as bad for the dairy industry as they now seem."

Test Case In Ontario Will Be Of Interest To Many Farmers

OTTAWA (CP)—Hearings will be reopened by the Supreme Court of Canada next month into a test case which will decide the validity of Ontario's widespread system of compulsory programs of marketing farm products.

The court asked Wednesday that arguments be presented Nov. 19 on one aspect of the complex legal problem of whether provincial marketing boards have power to levy charges on their farmers.

The decision could have a bearing on marketing plans in other provinces. For some months officials of federal and provincial governments have been making a special study of ways of strengthening the legal basis of existing plans. The fear is that if the Ontario marketing system is ruled invalid, chaos could result unless concerted action were taken to provide alternate methods immediately.

The main issue, which was argued in three days of court hearings last April, is whether charges collected by the marketing boards are service fees or indirect taxes which affect consumer prices. The federal government has the sole right to levy indirect taxation.

But another constitutional issue involved is the governmental division of powers over trade. Provinces have jurisdiction over trade within their borders while the central government has power over interprovincial and foreign trade.
