### Contract Bridge

#### BIDDING BOTH HANDS

Everybody has heard (and perhaps used) the bridge saying: "Just bid your own cards, partner, and I'll bid mine!" Usually, this is a sound principle, but there are times when it is wise to bid all 26 cards, in a manner of speaking. Consider this case:

South dealer.  
Both sides vulnerable.

♠ K 5 3	♥ A 9 7
♦ Q J 6 4 2	♣ Q J 8 6
♠ A	♥ 3

♠ J 9 7 2	♥ 5

♥ 9 2

South opened the bidding with one spade. (Some good players would prefer a club on South's hand, but it is this writer's opinion that the spade opening "stands out.")

East-West did not enter the auction, and the bidding proceeded, two hearts by North, three clubs by South. When this three-club bid got north, certain inferences were unmistakable. South was marked with at least ten cards in the black suits; and he could not be weaker than ace-queen in both suits to justify his bidding, unless he happened to have the ace or king of hearts, or the king of diamonds. His rapid ascension to the three-level could not have been justified on lesser values.

North fully realized that he could, if he chose, bid three diamonds over three clubs in an effort to show control of diamonds, and later jump to five clubs as a slam invitation. He also appreciated the more important fact, however, that this series of bids might not help South very much; that if South had only his minimum for the two bids he had made, he would not be able to "move" over five clubs.

So, on the fairly reasonable assumption that South's three red cards figured to be a singleton heart and two diamonds rather than the other way around, North took it upon himself to jump straight from three clubs to six clubs. In so doing, he was technically overbidding, in his own holding, but he was accurately appraising the combined resources.

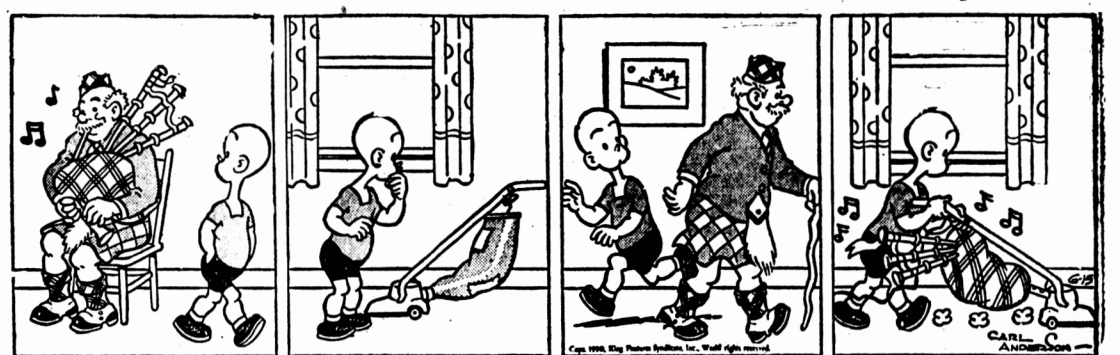

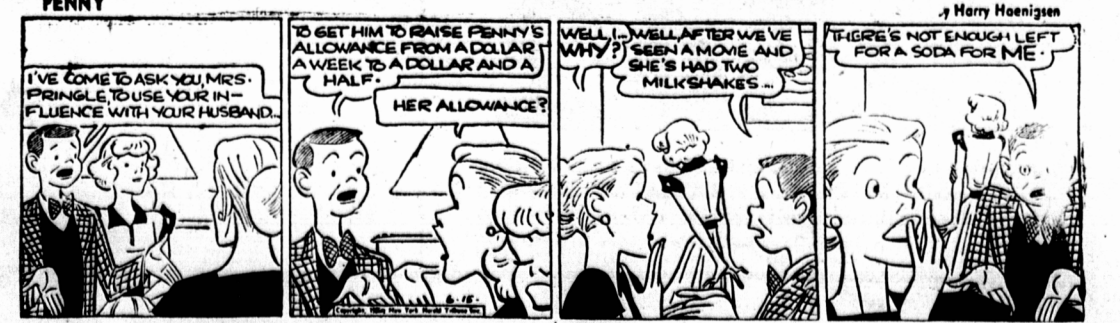
