THE POULTRY TRADE.

The Farming World reports that the Canadian Produce Company of Toronto, received last week a single order from Great Britain for ten tons of Canadian chickens. Think of it, farmers of Prince Edward Island. Of course the order was filled. But why cannot we, more than a thousand miles nearer the market have a share in this trade? It is well said by the Farming World that "our trade in dressed poultry with Great Britain is of immense development." What we need here first of all is a steamship direct from Charlottetown to Liverpool or London. All the rest will speedily follow.

What is the farmer's duty in relation to this new movement? The Farming World supplies the answer: "Get rid of all inferior or mongrel breeds of fowl and keep only those suitable for meeting the needs of this important trade. Such breeds as the Plymouth Rock, Wyandotte, Leghorn, etc., will be found suitable for this trade. Thus, with proper feed and care, there is no reason why the poultry department on every farm should not become one of its most important branches. There is money in poultry as has been shown many times in these columns, but care and skill must be exercised to get it out."

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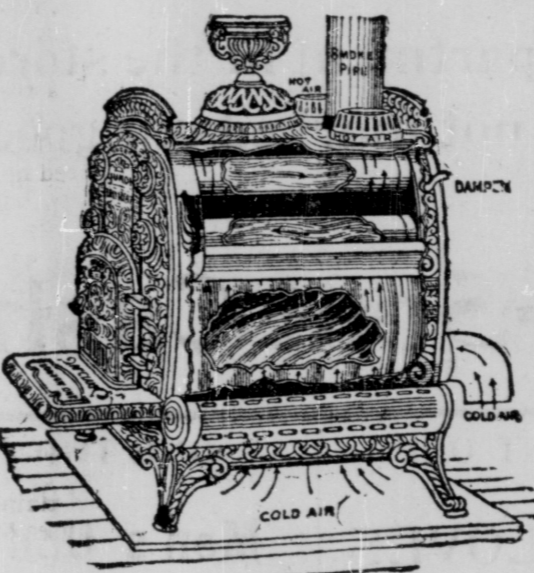
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Practically a Small Furnace and heats as much space as one.
