Small Docket At June Term of Supreme Court At Summerside Yesterday

Two indictments and one civil jury case comprised the small docket at the opening of the June term of the Supreme Court in Summerside yesterday, with Mr. Justice George J. Tweedy presiding.

IN THE FIRST INDICTMENT, the Grand Jury found a true bill against Vernon Walter Watson charged with theft. He was arraigned, pleaded "not guilty", and trial was set for today.

THE SECOND INDICTMENT contained two counts charging Leonard Philip Thibau with (1) attempting to break and enter with intent to steal, and (2) wilfully destroying property by night.

THE GRAND JURY found no bill on the first count, but returned a true bill on the second count. Thibau pleaded guilty and was sentenced to twelve months in Prince County Jail, with the court recommending that time already served since his arrest be allowed on the sentence.

THIS CASE RESULTED from an incident one night about February 15 at the store of Sterling Hunter in Kensington.

IN BOTH INDICTMENTS Mr. D. O. Stewart, Q.C., represented the Crown, while Mr. J. A. Gallant was counsel for the defendants.

THE CIVIL JURY CASE is one that has been adjourned from session to session through several terms of the court.
