

Charlottetown's Civic Administrators



RUSSELL C. CHANDLER

Chairman of the Civic Committee in charge of the arrangements for the visit of Their Majesties the King and Queen. Hardware Merchant, employed with Fennell & Chandler. Born at Charlottetown. Educated in the City Schools, and Prince of Wales College. Served in France during the Great War with the Canadian Field Artillery, and the Canadian Signal Corps, being twice wounded. Following the war continued his association with the militia and now holds the rank of Lieutenant Colonel in the Reserve of the Royal Canadian Corps of Signals. Member of the Charlottetown City Council representing Ward 4, and Chairman of the Finance Committee of the Council. Vice President of the Prince Edward Island Command of the Canadian Legion, B. E. S. L., Past President of the Queen's County Liberal Association, the Charlottetown Gyro Club, the Charlottetown Branch of the Canadian Legion, the Abegweit Amateur Athletic Association and the Army and Navy Club of Prince Edward Island.



DR. J. E. BLANCHARD

Born in Charlottetown 1894. Educated Queen Square School, Prince of Wales, St. Dunstan's University, graduated from Baltimore College of Dental Surgery 1915 with degree of Doctor of Dental Surgery. Captain in Canadian Army Dental Corps during the Great War. Practiced in Charlottetown since the war. Elected City Councillor representing Ward 5 for 8 years. Elected Fellowship in International College of Dentists. Elected delegate to the Dental Convention held in London, England in 1936. Married to Florence, the daughter of late Captain F. P. Gallant of Palmer Road, P. E. I. Dr. and Mrs. Blanchard have two daughters.



MAYOR E. A. FOSTER

Was born at Charlottetown, P. E. I. Received his education at West Kent School and St. Peter's Boys' School, Charlottetown. At an early age he entered the drug business with the late L. W. Watson and in 1900 accepted the position of chief clerk with A. W. Reddin, buying the business from Mr. Reddin in 1910. Mr. Foster was President of the P. E. I. Pharmaceutical Association for 1915 and 1916 and since 1926 he has been treasurer. He has been a member of The Canadian Pharmaceutical Council continuously from 1910 to 1938. At the convention at Montreal in 1927 he was elected President of the Canadian Pharmaceutical Association and in 1931 was elected an Honorary President. He is a Past President and Past District Deputy of the Sons of England; Past President of Victoria Lodge, A. F. & A. M. Mr. Foster was a member of the City Council from 1924 to 1932 and again from 1936 to 1938. He was elected Mayor of Charlottetown by acclamation in 1938. A member of the Church of England, Mr. Foster was married in 1912 and has a family of four children.

DR. HEATH McINTYRE

Was born at New London. His family moved to Montague in 1901. Educated at Montague School, Prince of Wales College and graduated from the University of Maryland with the degree, Doctor of Dental Surgery in 1915. After receiving his degree, he returned to Charlottetown to practise dentistry which he has continued for 23 years. He was elected to the City Council to represent Ward 4 in 1936 and re-elected in 1938 by acclamation, and is serving for the second time as Chairman of The Police Committee. Dr. McIntyre is an active member of the Charlottetown Rotary Club and a member of several fraternal orders. He is Provincial representative on the Dominion Dental Council of Canada, Secretary Registrar Treasurer of The P. E. I. Dental Association, Chairman of the free Dental Clinic Committee for Charlottetown school children.



DR. CHARLES DOUGAN

Was born at Georgetown in 1899. Attended Georgetown and Queen Square Schools, later entering St. Dunstan's University. After graduating from Tufts Dental College, Boston, in 1923, he returned to Charlottetown to practise dentistry. Elected to the Council in 1926, 28, 30 for Ward One; did not run for election in 1932 and 1934 but was elected in 1936 and 1938 in Ward Two. He is a member of the Knights of Columbus and The Gyro, president of the Abegweit Baseball League; president of the P. E. I. Dental Association. Dr. Dougan is very interested in baseball, hockey and horse racing and has acted as Judge and Starter at various Maritime races.



ANDREW A. HENNESSEY

Mr. Hennessey was born in Charlottetown on January 4th, 1880, a son of the late Michael and Margaret Hennessey. He received education in Queen Square School in this city. Soon after leaving school he became an employee with the H. & S. Lowes Contracting firm. Later he became associated with the firm of Parkman, Power and Hennessey and supervised the construction of the Rena MacLean Memorial Hospital which was situated on the present Government House Property. Subsequently he became an assistant with his father, the late Michael Hennessey in the Funeral Directing profession in Charlottetown. On the death of his father he started business for himself and has been directing his own Funeral Home since 1919. For 33 years previous to its reorganization a few years ago, Mr. Hennessey had been an active member of the Charlottetown Voluntary Fire Department. He is a past president of the Benevolent Irish Society; Past Grand Knight of the Charlottetown Council Knights of Columbus and is at present a fourth degree member of that same society. Mr. Hennessey has been a member of the Charlottetown City Council for ten years being first elected as the representative of Ward 3 in 1926. Since 1932 he has been the representative of Ward 1 on the Council Board, having been re-elected in that same Ward for the four succeeding terms. In 1912 he married Elizabeth A. McQuaid of St. Andrews, P. E. I. and has a family of five children, Dorothy, Harold, Thelma and Brenda.



HENRY LAPHORN

Manager of North American Life since 1908 member the firm of Laphorn & Stevenson. Elected City Councillor in 1936 representing Ward 5 and again in 1938. Served 2 years as Chairman of Fire Department; also on Street Committee and Public Property. In 1938 was appointed by Council as Chairman of Relief and Unemployment Committee; also on Street Committee and Public Property.
