The new series will retain familiar features of previous issues, including the privilege of redemption at full face value plus interest. Bonds of all issues may be cashed at 100 per cent plus earned interest any time at any Bank in Canada. Regional directors for the payroll savings plan have already been named.

**New Italian Gov't. Takes Office Today**

ROME (AP)—A new middle-road Italian government will be sworn in today, interrupting but not ending the drawn-out Italian political crisis.

Prime Minister Giuseppe Pella and his cabinet of Christian Democrats have made clear they intend to remain in office only long enough to accomplish three things: 1. Put a budget through Parliament. The current budget runs out Aug. 31 and chaos would result if nothing was done before then. 2. Solve the "urgent and practical" problems which have arisen in virtually every branch of government since the June 7-8 elec-

The Swiss painter Leopold Robert achieved a European reputation with his pictures of Italian peasant life.



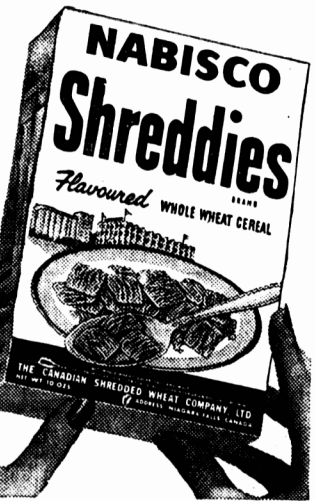

**New Savings Bond Series To Be Offered**

OTTAWA, (CP)—The eighth series of Canada savings bonds will go on sale to the public Oct. 19, the Bank of Canada announced Monday.

Bonds offered in the eighth series will be dated Nov. 1, 1953, and will mature Nov. 1, 1963. They will pay a full 3% per cent interest rate each year to maturity and will carry 12 annual interest coupons.

Sale of seventh series bonds will be discontinued Aug. 31 although applications for these bonds made prior to that date and arrangements for deferred payment will not be affected.

The new series may be purchased in denominations of \$50, \$100, \$500, \$1,000, and \$5,000, and must be registered in an individual's name whether adult or minor. The registration gives protection
