Ch'town Youths Sentenced To Two-Year Prison Term

SUMMERSIDE — James Joseph Gallant and Barry Joseph Gass, both of Charlottetown, were each sentenced to two years in Dorchester Penitentiary for having possession of a stolen vehicle, the property of Allison MacLeod Ltd., Charlottetown. Sentence was given by Magistrate Chester Macdonald in Prince County magistrate's court yesterday morning.

Evidence had been given in previous hearings that Gallant had stolen a 1963 model Rambler car from a building at the Charlottetown Exhibition Ground and had picked up Gass in Summerside where a girl that Gallant knew, was picked up at her home and the trio headed back for Charlottetown. Gass was driving the vehicle a few miles outside of Summerside when they were stopped and questioned by the RCMP.

The court appeared to be very much annoyed with several traditions that arose with the testimony of the three major witnesses and at various times during the hearings warned the witnesses of the seriousness of perjury.

Charlottetown police last night had seized three previous convictions, and Gallant has been convicted of break, entry and theft three times and theft, once, it was stated in court.

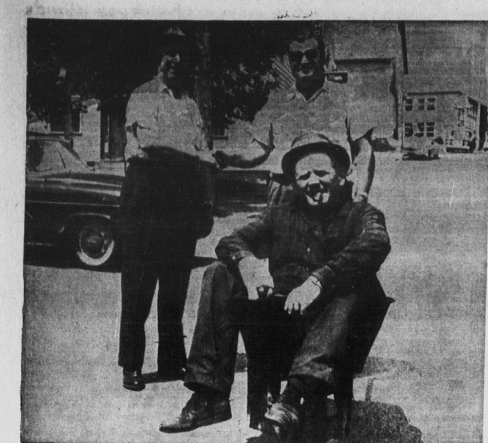
