Death At S'side Of E. M. Bishop

The death occurred yesterday at his home in Summerside of Elias M. Bishop, a life long resident of the town, in his 82nd year. The late Mr. Bishop had been in ill health for the past two years and for the last three months had been confined to bed.

He was a son of the late Mr. and Mrs. George A. Bishop. His father had started one of Summerside's oldest businesses, Bishop's Foundry and as a young man the late Mr. Bishop went to work in the foundry with his father. Later he and his brother, Thomas, bought out the business and operated it under the name of George Bishop and Sons Ltd. In 1934 Elias and Thomas Bishop divided the business, Elias retaining the foundry and Thomas taking the machine shop. Mr. Bishop operated the business until his illness and remained the owner till his death.

He was a man of a very retiring disposition and his main pleasure was to take an automobile drive through the country on summer evenings. He is survived by his wife, the former Fay MacKenzie of Rustico, two sons, George and Harry and a daughter, Lucy, Mrs. Balfour MacKay, all of Summerside. His brother, Thomas, and a sister, Mrs. G. W. Bell of Summerside also survive. The body is resting at the Boxwell Funeral Home and funeral services will be held on Monday at 2 p.m. Interment will be in the People's Cemetery.—S.
