

# Bucky Harris Says Cheap Homers Helping Yanks

**NEW YORK (CP)**—Bucky Harris, former boss of the American League New York Yankees but now manager of the rival Washington Senators, says the world champions get most of their mileage on "cheap home runs."  
 He added that the Yanks aren't what they used to be and he wouldn't be surprised to see the Chicago White Sox beat them out in their bid for a fifth American League pennant.  
 "You have to go with the Yanks because of the five-game lead," the lead-ridden Washington pilot said, shortly before departing for the all-star game in Cincinnati.  
 But they're not the team they were last year, or the year before, Harris said. He and Vic Raschi, Ronald Allen and Vic Raschi, their two big relievers, aren't pitching as well. The team as a whole isn't as solid, not as sure of itself.  
 "Personally, I like the White Sox. They've got a lot of fire and spirit. They're driving."

 Merle Longaple turned in a good game for Parkdale at first base.

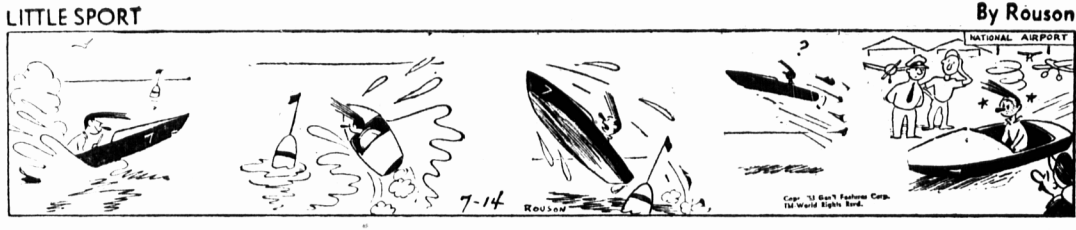

# M.C.A. In 3rd Place Tie After 13-9 Win Over The Intermediate Abbies

Maritime Central Airways moved into a third place tie with the Curran and Briggs Juniors in the Island Baseball League last night by defeating the League leading Intermediate Abbies 13-9 on Memorial Field.
