Recovery Move On Montreal Stock Market

MONTREAL, Aug. 9.—(CP)—Prices crept quietly higher in a moderate stock market recovery Saturday.

After a display of early strength, Canadian Car Preferred dropped 1-2 to 19 in steady liquidation while the common eased to finish even at 8 1-2. C.P.R. improved narrowly.

Papers, recent weak spots, came back a bit. Light buying brought fractional gains for St. Lawrence Corporation Preferred at 11 3-4 and Dryden at 5 3-4. Erasing an early loss, St. Lawrence Paper closed unchanged at 32 1-2.

Outstanding utility gainer was Bell Telephone, up two points at 149, while B.C. Power and Montreal Power advanced slightly. Shawinigan and Power Corporation registered losses.

Share Market Prices Boosted On Saturday

(By Frank MacMillan, Associated Press Financial Writer)

NEW YORK, Aug. 9.—(AP)—The share market, pushed vigorously ahead Saturday to new average peaks since June, 1931, leaders showing advances of fractions to around 2 points.

For the first time since February of this year all three divisions of the Associated Press share average reached new tops simultaneously, while the 60-stock compilation touched its six-year record at 69.6, up 5 of a point.

The 30 industrials, at 92.0, and the 10-issue divisions of rails at 41.3 and utilities at 53.4 were each at tops for four years or longer.

McIntyre, with a gain of 2 1-4 points, headlined activity in the Canadian list. Imperial Oil of Canada, Quebec P. & W. and Dominion Stores were up fractionally along with Ford of Canada. Other Canadian stocks were unchanged or off minor fractions.

Turnover in the stock exchange was 865,270 shares, the liveliest two-hour day, with one exception, since early April.

Non-ferrous metal stocks found a few willing buyers, although trading was not especially active.

Kennecott 46 and McIntyre Porcupine at 41 1-2, each added more than a point, while fractional improvement was recorded for Anaconda at 40, International at 51 7-8, and Cerro De Pasco at 53.

General Electric was the day's most active stock, advancing more than a point at 47 3-4, after having been at 48 1-4, for a time, a new 1936 top.

Among active shares ahead fractions to more than a point were American Water Works at 26 3-4, North American at 35, Illinois Central at 26 1-2, Santa Fe at 88, Sears Roebuck at 84 3-8, Continental Can at 70 1-2 Consolidated Edison at 43 5-8, Union Pacific at 145, Bethlehem at 59 1-8, U. S. Steel at 68 1-4 and International Harvester at 83 1-2.

Bonds, especially the rails, followed the share market higher, although Italian loans were again unsettled.

McIntyre dropped 1-4 on a trade of 100 shares and Lake Shore and Dome declined minor fractions while losses of 10 cents each were booked for Wright Hargreaves, Teck Hughes, Central Patricia and O'Brien. McLeod-Cockshutt and Buffalo-Akerite lost 25 cents each.
